Sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time - February 10-11, 2024

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



In modern times due to the widespread use of antibiotics, leprosy has been reduced to less than 1 occurrence in 10,000 people, worldwide, isolated mostly to developing countries and depressed socio-economic regions. Therefore, unlike other periods of civilized history, the drama of today's readings fails to inspire the intense reaction that it would have received in the first century during Jesus' ministry. Therefore, as a spiritual exercise, consider your reaction if, instead of leprosy, one were to substitute, "HIV/AIDS", or "cancer", or "mental illness"? What if we were to insert a particularly serious sin? Do we believe that the Lord has the ability to not only heal, but restore those who find themselves blotched by the notoriety of their failings?

The person with leprosy in today's Gospel proclaims in faith to Jesus, "If you wish, you can make me clean," to which Jesus replies "I do will it. Be made clean!" (Mark 1: 40-41) Is there any more-comforting thought to have on the doorstep of Lent than to know that our Lord does desire that we be released from the spiritual and physical ailments that bedevil us? During this upcoming Lent, what is it that you want to be freed from? Do you have the courage to ask in faith and receive that healing grace?

Lenten Regulations:



The Season of Lent begins this year on **Ash Wednesday, February 14, 2024** and will end just prior to the Evening Mass of the Lord's Supper on Holy Thursday, **March 29, 2024**, when the Paschal Triduum begins. Lent is the principal penitential season in the Church year. All Christian Faithful are urged to develop and maintain a program of self-denial, prayer, and the performance of deeds of charity and mercy (including giving of alms), *in addition to* the following *minimal* Lenten disciplines:

ABSTINENCE – Everyone 14 years of age and over is bound to abstain from meat on Ash Wednesday and all the Fridays of Lent.

While abstinence is not required under the age of 14, it is laudable that parents teach children abstinence and other suitable acts of penance as a way to learn and understand the true spirit of the Lenten season.

FAST – Everyone 18 years of age and under 59 is required to fast on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday. On these two days of fast and abstinence, only one full meatless meal is permitted. Two other meatless meals, sufficient to maintain strength may be taken according to each person's needs, but together these two should not equal another full meal. Eating between meals is not permitted, but liquids are allowed.

Over age 59, it is laudable to follow the discipline of fasting on these days, but one should not scruple about modifying or breaking the fast at this age when matters of health and well-being come into question.

Under age 59, when pregnant or nursing, performing significant manual labor, or suffering from a serious illness (a chronic illness such as diabetes or hypoglycemia, or a more immediate illness where fasting would not be healthy,) it may be morally impossible to follow this precept, and so it would not be binding.

To disregard completely the law of fast and abstinence is seriously sinful.

"Seriously sinful" is a moral theologian's code word for "mortal sin," given a person acting with knowledge, freedom, and choice. 'Accidents' are not necessarily mortal sins, but may perhaps be a sign that one is not taking one's Lenten disciplines seriously enough, which may be a separate issue for one's conscience.

Masses on **Ash Wednesday** will be at **7:30 a.m.** at St. Anthony Church, **8:30 a.m.** at St. Dominic School, and at **6:30 p.m.** at St. Anthony Church.

Each Wednesday during Lent (after Ash Wednesday), in addition to Mass at St. Dominic School, there will be a **6:00 p.m. Mass** at St. Anthony Church, with **Stations of the Cross beginning at 5:30 p.m.**
