First Sunday of Lent

FEBRUARY 18, 2024

Genesis 9:8-15; 1 Peter 3:18-22: Mark 1:12-15

In one word, Lent is baptism! It is the final preparation time for baptism which (in the ancient Church) was conferred only during the Easter Vigil. For those of us who have been baptized long ago, it is the time of baptismal renewal. By our baptism, we entered into a covenant with God the Father in and through Jesus Christ.

Our first reading speaks of the covenant with Noah after the flood. The liturgy sees this as a symbol of our covenant with God through the waters of baptism. God promises good things for us; we for our part must keep our baptismal promises: to renounce sin and Satan, and to live for Christ.

Our second reading is from 1 Peter. Many scholars consider this book to be an ancient baptismal homily. The author tells us that we are cleansed of sin through baptism, and that we share in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent is always that of the fast and temptations of Jesus. But Mark's Gospel does not give any details. Rather, it states simply that the Spirit "drove" or "impelled" Jesus into the desert where he was tested. Afterward, he proclaimed the good news.

Each of us has his particular temptations. Satan attacks us at our most vulnerable point. But we have the power of Jesus Christ to overcome all temptation, for God never permits us to be tempted beyond our strength. Let us, then, renew our fidelity to our baptismal covenant. In the power of Christ, let us die to selfishness and sin, and rise daily to manifest the glory of his resurrection.

1ST SUNDAY OF LENT

As we begin this Lenten season the Gospel takes us into the desert with Jesus. Remember these next 40 days are the desert for us. What was the desert and the number 40 meaning for the Jewish people? The number 40 and the desert are both times of trial, tribulation and formation. God uses the 40 days of Noah on the ark in the desert of the water as a trial and time of reforming the world. God uses the 40 years in the desert of the Israelites wandering as a time of trial and reforming His people. There are many instances of 40, but you get the hint. Where all of these instances of forty the people were not faithful, Jesus' 40 days in the desert are to show us how to be faithful in time of trial and reform. Allow this Lent to be a trial. Make your Lenten practices tough. Allow this Lent to be a time of reform of your life. Be faithful to your Lenten practices. See how God draws us into the wilderness, so that He can strengthen us for the passion to bring us to the resurrection. Be intentional. Don't give up. IF you fail in your practices, start anew immediately! Never give up. Choose the Lord this Lent. Please pray for myself and the team and candidates as we enter into Cursillo #366.


