First Sunday of Lent

FEBRUARY 18, 2024

Genesis 9:8-15; 1 Peter 3:18-22: Mark 1:12-15

In one word, Lent is baptism! It is the final preparation time for baptism which (in the ancient Church) was conferred only during the Easter Vigil. For those of us who have been baptized long ago, it is the time of baptismal renewal. By our baptism, we entered into a covenant with God the Father in and through Jesus Christ.

Our first reading speaks of the covenant with Noah after the flood. The liturgy sees this as a symbol of our covenant with God through the waters of baptism. God promises good things for us; we for our part must keep our baptismal promises: to renounce sin and Satan, and to live for Christ.

Our second reading is from 1 Peter. Many scholars consider this book to be an ancient baptismal homily. The author tells us that we are cleansed of sin through baptism, and that we share in the resurrection of Jesus Christ.

The Gospel of the First Sunday of Lent is always that of the fast and temptations of Jesus. But Mark's Gospel does not give any details. Rather, it states simply that the Spirit "drove" or "impelled" Jesus into the desert where he was tested. Afterward, he proclaimed the good news.

Each of us has his particular temptations. Satan attacks us at our most vulnerable point. But we have the power of Jesus Christ to overcome all temptation, for God never permits us to be tempted beyond our strength. Let us, then, renew our fidelity to our baptismal covenant. In the power of Christ, let us die to selfishness and sin, and rise daily to manifest the glory of his resurrection.

First Sunday of Lent, February 18, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend we celebrate the First Sunday in our season of Lent. The gospel readings for this first Sunday are always concerning the temptations of Jesus. It is interesting to note that our particular gospel reading is from the gospel of Mark, very short but filled with deep meaning. With Mark's presentation, Jesus just had been baptized by John and according to the gospel, "the Spirit drove Jesus out into the desert, and He remained in the desert for forty days, tempted by Satan." From the account of His baptism, Jesus is the Holy one of God, but He is also the suffering Servant. In his baptism Jesus took upon Himself the sins of all humanity. And thus He is driven into the desert. Mark wants us to recall the Jewish celebration of Yom Kippur, during which all the sins of the Jewish community were placed upon a goat and that goat was "driven" into the desert. Jesus then becomes for all of us that "scapegoat" as He is driven into the desert with our sins upon Him. Even though the gospel is short, it is very rich with meaning for us as we look at our own sins this Lent, repent of them, and realize that Jesus suffered and died for us as the scapegoat for our sins.

I also want to remind you that we will be celebrating an additional Mass at 6:30 p.m., Monday through Friday during the season of Lent. Since prayer is so much a part of our Lenten practice, I would encourage our parishioners to celebrate the greatest prayer that we have which is our Eucharist. What a gift God gives to us in the Eucharist and I just invite you to take advantage of this gift by celebrating the Eucharist with us during Lent. Further, to assist us in our Lenten practices, we will also be celebrating the Sacrament of Reconciliation on Mondays, Wednesdays, and Fridays from 5:45-6:15 p.m. Don't wait until the last minute to return to the Lord sacramentally and feel His peace and forgiveness in your lives.

Next weekend, we begin our Lenten mission. During the Masses for that weekend, we will have the opportunity to hear Fr. Denis Robinson, the rector of St. Meinrad Seminary in Indiana, preaching on the Eucharist and how it relates to our Lenten season. Fr. Denis is an excellent preacher and we are privileged to have him join us for this mission. I encourage you to attend one of our Masses for this weekend. Then he will also be giving two additional talks to us with the same message. These talks will be on Sunday and Monday nights, February 25 and 26, at 6:30 p.m. in the Church. Then we will conclude our Lenten mission with a reception on Monday night immediately after the presentation. Come and join us and be inspired by Fr. Denis Robinson.

I was hoping that the Lenten books that I ordered would have arrived last weekend, as announced in the bulletin. But we didn't receive them until last Monday when we made them available. If there are any left they can be found in the narthex. They are entitled "Lent 2024" from Our Daily Visitor. As you are in the narthex, I ask you also to pick up and take home a "Rice Bowl" as a reminder to you of our Lenten practice called almsgiving. The rice bowls are reminders to us that people do go hungry each day and perhaps through the sacrifices that we make each day the money saved could be placed in these rice bowls for those who are in need of our care and our support. So please take home a rice bowl.
