FROM THE DESK OF FATHER SAIKI

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

I hope your Lent is going well so far! This is such a rich time of focus on our relationship with God, and how we relate to the world and ourselves. We have such powerful tools to help us refocus and reprioritize our lives and place God and our relationship with Him first, make Him the center of all we do, namely prayer, fasting, and almsgiving.

I hope we all have a plan for how we will use each of these tools this Lent. With prayer, we have opportunities such as daily Mass, adoration on Tuesdays, Stations of the Cross on Fridays, and the Women's Lenten Retreat which is coming up on March 9th to help us to foster greater prayer in our daily lives. Fasting is foster by giving things up, abstaining from eating meat on Fridays, and considering what we truly need and what is excess in our lives, and putting them all before the Lord, asking for His help to purify our perspectives and dependence on worldly things.

Almsgiving is intentional giving to those in need, especially to sanctify our wealth, bringing God into our finances, and putting our material goods in the context of eternity. Of course, we must provide for our families, and prosper in this life, but we must be so careful to avoid making wealth and money the sole focus of life, that which we live for, that which dominates our lives. Almsgiving is a form of renouncing money or wealth's power over us and making it an expression of love for God and neighbor. Offering a gift to a charity, like Catholic Charities, a soup kitchen, or crisis pregnancy clinic is a great way to engage in almsgiving. Making a more consistent offering to the parish is another way. Making a gift to the Archbishop's Call to Share (ACTS) is another great way to use our worldly goods for the sake of others.

Our parish goal this year for ACTS is to raise \$26,759.00. As of February 11th, our parish has raised \$17,300.00, which is 65% of our goal. This is wonderful! We are making terrific progress. What I see as a great challenge is that only 8% of our parish has participated in this campaign, which means 92% of the parish has not participated. I know that finances are tight, and inflation is having a terrible impact on all of us. But I invite the 92% who have not participated in ACTS to consider making a gift. It does not have to be a big gift. Any gift will have an impact in supporting the many ministries that ACTS supports. Perhaps we can give a gift which might equal a month's subscription to a streaming service? Perhaps we can offer a gift that equals a cup of coffee or eating out once? Perhaps we can make a gift equal to buying an outfit or device or game? We can offer that amount of a monthly subscription, coffee, outfit, device, or game as a sacrifice for others, as a gift to God and bring Him into even those smaller daily or monthly financial considerations. We can even use that gift to examine our consciences and consider what our relationship is with material good and money, and how much God and His people are a part of them. I encourage you, if you are part of the 92%, to prayerfully discern if you can make a small gift to the ACTS campaign, increase our parish's commitment to our brothers and sisters in the Archdiocese, and use this as a way to foster almsgiving this Lent.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

¡Espero que su Cuaresma va bien! Este es un momento muy rico para centrarnos en nuestra relación con Dios y en cómo nos relacionamos con el mundo y con nosotros mismos. Contamos con herramientas tan poderosas que nos ayudan a reenfocarnos y priorizar nuestras vidas y poner a Dios y nuestra relación con Él en primer lugar, convertirlo en el centro de todo lo que hacemos, es decir, la oración, el ayuno y la limosna.

Espero que todos tengamos un plan sobre cómo usaremos cada una de estas herramientas esta Cuaresma. Con la oración, tenemos oportunidades como la Misa diaria, la adoración los martes, el Vía Crucis los viernes para ayudarnos a fomentar una mayor oración en nuestra vida diaria. El ayuno se fomenta renunciando a cosas, absteniéndonos de comer carne los viernes y considerando lo que realmente necesitamos y lo que es extra y sobra en nuestras vidas, y poniéndolo todo ante el Señor, pidiendo Su ayuda para purificar nuestras perspectivas y dependencia de las cosas mundanas.

La limosna es dar intencionalmente a los necesitados, especialmente para santificar nuestras riquezas, traer a Dios a nuestras finanzas y poner nuestros bienes materiales en el contexto de la eternidad. Por supuesto, debemos mantener a nuestras familias y prosperar en esta vida, pero debemos tener mucho cuidado de evitar que la riqueza y el dinero sean el único foco de la vida, aquello por lo que vivimos, lo que domina nuestras vidas. La limosna es una forma de renunciar al poder del dinero o de la riqueza sobre nosotros y convertirlo en una expresión de amor a Dios y al prójimo. Ofrecer una donación a una organización caritativa, como Caridades Católicas, un comedor de beneficencia o una clínica de embarazos en crisis, es una excelente manera de participar en la donación de limosnas. Otra manera es hacer una ofrenda más consistente a la parroquia. Hacer una donación al Llamado a Compartir del Arzobispo (ACTS) es otra excelente manera de utilizar nuestros bienes mundanos por el bien de los demás.

Nuestra meta parroquial este año para ACTS es recaudar \$26,759.00. Hasta el 11 de febrero, nuestra parroquia ha recaudado \$17,300.00, que es el 65% de nuestra meta. ¡Esto es maravilloso! Estamos logrando un progreso tremendo. Lo que veo como un gran desafío es que solo el 8% de nuestra parroquia ha participado en esta campaña, lo que significa que el 92% de la parroquia no ha participado. Sé que las finanzas están apretadas y que la inflación está teniendo un impacto terrible en todos nosotros. Pero invito al 92% que no ha participado en ACTS a que consideren hacer una donación. No tiene por qué ser un gran regalo. Cualquier donación tendrá un impacto en el apoyo a los numerosos ministerios que apoya ACTS. ¿Quizás podamos hacer un regalo que equivalga a un mes de suscripción a un servicio de streaming? ¿Quizás podamos ofrecer un regalo que equivalga a una taza de café o a salir a comer una vez? ¿Quizás podamos hacer un regalo equivalente a comprar un atuendo, una tecnología o un juego? Podemos ofrecer esa cantidad de suscripción mensual, café, ropa, tecnología o juego como un sacrificio por los demás, como un regalo a Dios y llevarlo incluso a esas consideraciones financieras diarias o mensuales más pequeñas. Incluso podemos usar ese don para examinar nuestra conciencia y considerar cuál es nuestra relación con el bien material y el dinero, y en qué medida Dios y su pueblo son parte de ellos. Le animo, si usted es parte del 92%, a discernir en oración si puede hacer una pequeña donación a la campaña ACTS, aumentar el compromiso de nuestra parroquia con nuestros hermanos y hermanas en la Arquidiócesis y utilizar esto como una forma de fomentar la limosna. Esta Cuaresma.

FISH FRY—PESCADO FRITO

The Knights of Columbus Jose Sanchez del Rio, invite you to come by every Friday of Lent to enjoy of a wonderful Fish Fry from 4 p.m. to 7 p.m. You are welcome to come have dinner before Stations of the Cross which begin at 6 p.m. or right after Stations.

"All persons who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence" (Canon 1252). The U. S. Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB) extended this law to include all Fridays in Lent.

Since Jesus sacrificed his flesh for us on Good Friday, we refrain from eating flesh meat in his honor on Fridays. Flesh meat includes the meat of mammals and poultry, and the main foods that come under this heading are beef and pork, chicken and turkey. While flesh is prohibited, the non-flesh products of these animals are not, things like milk, cheese, butter, and eggs. Fish do not belong to the flesh meat category.

Dado que Jesús sacrificó su carne por nosotros el Viernes Santo, nos abstendemos de comer carne en su honor los viernes. La carne incluye la carne de mamíferos y aves, y los principales alimentos que se incluyen en este epígrafe son la carne de res y de cerdo, el pollo y el pavo. Si bien la carne está prohibida, los productos no cárnicos de estos animales no lo están, como la leche, el queso, la mantequilla y los huevos. El pescado no pertenece a la categoría de carne.
