FROM THE DESK OF FATHER SAIKI

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Lent is fast approaching! Ash Wednesday is on February 14, so just over a week from now. Even before we enter the season of Lent, we should take some time and consider how we will spend this Lent. It is customary to give something up for the season of Lent, perhaps a junk food, a television show, a game, social media, or even a hobby. While it is very noble to give something up for Lent, so often we go right back to that thing we gave up once we arrive at Easter.

I think we can have a deeper experience of the season, and a more fruitful growth in the spiritual life if we focus on behaviors, habits, or activities that are actually bad for us, actually sinful, actually prevent us from growing closer to God. We can give those up and seek to make a more permanent and definitive change in our lives.

So over the next couple of weeks, we might consider if there is a particular vice that we need to root out of our lives so that we might be better people? Perhaps we need to cut back on drinking, binge eating, inappropriate use of the Internet, wasting time on social media, gossip, or idleness. Maybe we can look at our regularity in attending Mass on Sundays and holy days of obligation and make those a greater priority. Are there relationships that need purifying, that lead us into sin on a regular basis?

We do not have to consider Lent only in terms of giving things up or fasting. We certainly should also consider growing in prayer and alms giving as well. Is there a good work we can take up? Could we incorporate more prayer each day in Lent? Could we come to Mass once or twice during the week, beyond our Sunday obligation? Could we increase our use of the sacrament of Penance? Could we be more consistent in our tithing?

There are so many ways we can observe this holy season and make a more permanent and lasting improvement in our faith life. So please take this week and begin discerning how you might make the most of this Lent and use this time to deepen your relationship with the Lord and the Church.

¡La Cuaresma se acerca rápidamente! El Miércoles de Ceniza es el 14 de febrero, por lo que dentro de poco más de una semana. Incluso antes de entrar en la temporada de Cuaresma, debemos tomarnos un tiempo y considerar cómo pasaremos esta Cuaresma. Es costumbre renunciar a algo durante la temporada de Cuaresma, tal vez una comida chatarra, un programa de televisión, un juego, las redes sociales o incluso un pasatiempo. Si bien es muy noble renunciar a algo durante la Cuaresma, muchas veces volvemos a lo que renunciamos una vez que llegamos a la Pascua.

Creo que podemos tener una experiencia más profunda de esta temporada y un crecimiento más fructífero en la vida espiritual si nos enfocamos en comportamientos, hábitos o actividades que en realidad son malos para nosotros, en realidad pecaminosos, y que en realidad nos impiden acercarnos más a Dios. Podemos renunciar a ellos y buscar hacer un cambio más permanente y definitivo en nuestras vidas. Entonces, durante las próximas semanas, podríamos considerar si hay algún vicio en particular que debamos erradicar de nuestras vidas para poder ser mejores personas. Quizás necesitemos reducir el consumo de alcohol, los atracones, el uso inapropiado de Internet, la pérdida de tiempo en las redes sociales, los chismes o la ociosidad. Tal vez podamos analizar nuestra regularidad en la asistencia a Misa los domingos y días santos de precepto y darles mayor prioridad. ¿Hay relaciones que necesitan purificación, que nos llevan al pecado de forma regular?

No tenemos que considerar la Cuaresma únicamente en términos de renunciar a cosas o ayunar. Ciertamente también deberíamos considerar crecer en oración y dar limosna. ¿Hay algún buen trabajo que podamos emprender? ¿Podríamos incorporar más oración cada día en Cuaresma? ¿Podríamos asistir a Misa una o dos veces durante la semana, más allá de nuestra obligación dominical? ¿Podríamos aumentar nuestro uso del sacramento de la Penitencia? ¿Podríamos ser más consistentes en nuestra limosna?

Hay muchas maneras en que podemos observar este tiempo santo y lograr una mejora más permanente y duradera en nuestra vida de fe. Así que tomemos esta semana y comencemos a discernir cómo podamos aprovechar al máximo esta Cuaresma y utilizar este tiempo para profundizar nuestra relación con el Señor y la Iglesia.
