

The Schedule for Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Please keep in mind that for both Christmas and Easter, all of our churches are on a five-year rotation, so that each of our churches can enjoy the benefit of most favored times for our liturgical celebrations. Those of you who were at the Easter Vigil last year saw a moving celebration with ministries exercised by members of our Youth Group and youth from SHDC. Every church moves "one step over". Here's how things look for the year 2024:

Holy Thursday, ICC, 7:30 p.m. Good Friday, SHDC, 3:00 p.m. Holy Saturday, SHW, 7:30 p.m. Easter Sunday Masses: SMH, 8:00 a.m. SPPN, 10:00 a.m.

Confessions: Sunday, March 24, SPPN, and ICC, 6-8 p.m. Monday, March 25, SHW, 6-8 p.m., Tuesday, March 26, SMH, 6-8 p.m., Wednesday, March 27, SHDC, 6-8 p.m. Also, before and after weekday Masses.

Father Tony will be in Peoria on Tuesday, March 5, for Priest Assembly Days. As decisions for Growing Disciples comes closer, our priests will receive updates concerning Growing Disciples. Please continue in your prayers for our churches and our school!

Looking Ahead: Our Youth Group's next meeting is Sunday, March 3, at 7 p.m. at the ICC Parish Center Hall. Our Spanish Mass resumes Sunday, March 10, at 5 p.m., at ICC. And our Healing Service is set for Saturday evening, March 16, after the 5:30 SMH Mass.

Healing Service Prayer Teams: We're looking for parishioners who are willing to be at the Healing Services on the third Saturday of the month at SMH after the 5:30 p.m. Mass, for the purpose of offering prayer. The purpose of the prayer is twofold: to obtain protection from the influence of any evil spirits and their deception; and to "cover" the evening with prayer fortifying the ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner, the sacraments of the Anointing of the Sick and Penance, and intercessory prayer for the cause of Bishop Fulton Sheen.
