- CHAPLAIN'S REFLECTION...

Ironically throughout history God has worked through fools, using them as his prophets and spokesmen. But they nevertheless boldly spoke the truth,

often at their own peril. And they were plain if not repulsive persons, rarely clean—cut nor impressive individuals.

Moses was an insecure, stuttering murderer on the run. And then there was Amos, a sheep herder from Tekoa.

The last of the prophets was John the Baptist. He "...wore a garment of camel's hair, and a leather girdle around his waist; and his food was locusts and wild honey." (Matt 3:4) In appearance he was a strange fellow, unlike the officials of Judaism in their fine garments at the Temple.

And John directed attention toward a humble carpenter from the backwater town of Nazareth and pointed to him as the Messiah. "John preached: "After me comes he who is mightier than I, the thong of his sandals I am not worthy to stoop down and untie." (Mark 1: 7)

Is it any wonder that proper people in the Jewish establishment ignored that carpenter, Jesus?

And who did he draw around him as his followers but a rag-tag band of ordinary folk, fishermen, a tax collector, and a revolutionary?

Few of them had any education or could read. Who would take serious this group, much less listen to the extraordinary claims they were making?

And people wondered why many Jews did not follow Jesus. Good heavens, it made little sense to rational men and women!

I could go on and on with examples from figures from the Bible who were foolish, common and even reluctant figures. But God has consistently chose such persons as his spokesmen.

The Scriptures speak to this. Jesus in a prayer to His Father stated: "I give you praise Father, Lord of heaven and earth, for although you have hidden these things from the wise and the learned you have revealed them to the childlike." (Luke: 10:21)

God speaks through fools to the humble of heart. The proud ignore such spokesmen. And I believe that God speaks to the human family today. And if so, is it not likely that he at times continues to speaks through fools?

Our tendency is to listen to the establishment, "the beautiful people" and the celebrities. But that is often not the spokesmen that God chooses.
