Third Sunday of Lent

MARCH 3, 2024

Exodus 20:1-17 or Exodus 20: 1-3, 7-8, 12-17;
1 Corinthians 1:22-25; John 2:13-25

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used
for the first and second readings.]

It would be a wonderful world if everyone kept the Ten Commandments! In the first reading, God gives the commandments to Moses. If everyone kept the commandments, there would be no crime. There would be no illegitimate or unwanted children. There would be no theft or murder or dishonesty. There would be respect among all peoples.

If everyone kept the commandments, we would be truly wise. The second reading tells us, however, that true wisdom goes beyond the commandments. True wisdom is to accept Jesus Christ as Lord over every aspect of our lives.

A lot of “sophisticated” people (the “Greeks” of the second reading) look for a secular philosophy or another wisdom. Some of us are like the Pharisees or Jews of old: We want to see signs and wonders or we won’t believe! But we have true wisdom if we are loyal to Jesus Christ even in his cross. The wisdom of God is wiser than that of any human genius.

In the Gospel, Jesus angrily drives the money changers out of the temple. He calls for a spirit of prayer, and not for a lot of buying and selling and “doing things” in the name of religion.

How genuine is our faith? Do we just “go through the motions?” Do we truly keep God’s commandments? Do we think that we shall somehow find wisdom elsewhere? Let us renew our loyalty to the Lord.

Today, we celebrate the first of three *Scrutinies* with our Elect. In the ancient Church, the Scrutinies were tests which catechumens had to pass before they were judged worthy to be baptized. Nowadays, they are simply prayers for the Elect. But we might ask ourselves if we could pass the Lord’s test in order to be a member of his people!

4TH SUNDAY OF LENT

Fascinating readings this weekend. The Israelites are unfaithful. They worship the gods of the pagan world around them. In Chronicles we hear how the Lord is condemning them for their unfaithfulness and calling them back to Himself and right worship. Jeremiah is referenced here as prophesying about their unfaithfulness and how God will call them back to right worship in the promised land through the most unlikely of circumstances. They were taken into captivity by the Babylonians and the Persians conquer the Babylonians. Cyrus the King of Persia the most unlikely of people not only frees the Israelites from captivity, but sends them back to the promised land, AND declares the Lord as God and re-builds His temple in Jerusalem. WOW! God can use Cyrus to do this immensely great work. Just think of what He can do with you if you just give yourself to Him. This is what the Lord is seeking...YOU!

The Gospel is about the Lord's desire to heal you of the poison of sin and eternal death. The serpent lifted up as their salvation in the desert was a foretaste of Jesus being lifted up on the cross for our salvation. Then John gives us the famous passage about our salvation. BE NOT DECEIVED by many of our protestant brothers and sisters that translate this passage that "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that all who believes in Him WILL not perish, but WILL have eternal life." The passage SHOULD read, "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him MIGHT not perish, but MIGHT have eternal life." Very different translation. The passage doesn't use words of certainty, but possibility. This passage is that the Lord desires to save us, but we must give ourselves to Him. Look upon the crucified Jesus and see your salvation and follow Him to the Cross, to YOUR Cross. He desires to save you from eternal death and offer you eternal life. Will you accept it? Will you take up your cross? Will you follow Him? HE IS SEEKING YOU!

What a phenomenal speaker and thank you to so many for showing up and growing in our life of faith together! 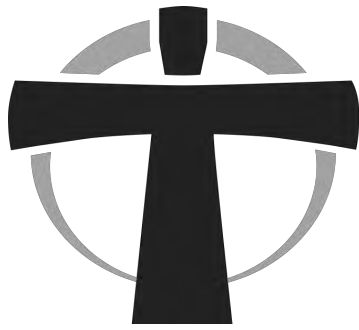
