Third Sunday of Lent

MARCH 3, 2024

Exodus 20:1-17 or Exodus 20: 1-3, 7-8, 12-17; 1 Corinthians 1:22-25; John 2:13-25

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

It would be a wonderful world if everyone kept the Ten Commandments! In the first reading, God gives the commandments to Moses. If everyone kept the commandments, there would be no crime. There would be no illegitimate or unwanted children. There would be no theft or murder or dishonesty. There would be respect among all peoples.

If everyone kept the commandments, we would be truly wise. The second reading tells us, however, that true wisdom goes beyond the commandments. True wisdom is to accept Jesus Christ as Lord over every aspect of our lives.

A lot of "sophisticated" people (the "Greeks" of the second reading) look for a secular philosophy or another wisdom. Some of us are like the Pharisees or Jews of old: We want to see signs and wonders or we won't believe! But we have true wisdom if we are loyal to Jesus Christ even in his cross. The wisdom of God is wiser than that of any human genius.

In the Gospel, Jesus angrily drives the money changers out of the temple. He calls for a spirit of prayer, and not for a lot of buying and selling and "doing things" in the name of religion.

How genuine is our faith? Do we just "go through the motions?" Do we truly keep God's commandments? Do we think that we shall somehow find wisdom elsewhere? Let us renew our loyalty to the Lord.

Today, we celebrate the first of three Scrutinies with our Elect. In the ancient Church, the Scrutinies were tests which catechumens had to pass before they were judged worthy to be baptized. Nowadays, they are simply prayers for the Elect. But we might ask ourselves if we could pass the Lord's test in order to be a member of his people!

Dear Parishioners,

This weekend the Church celebrates the Fourth Sunday of Lent, with this Sunday being designated as "Laetare" Sunday. The reason for this particular designation is found in the Entrance Antiphon for this Mass which begins with the following phrase, "Rejoice, Jerusalem." Since we do not use the entrance antiphons for our Masses because we always have an entrance song, we don't get to hear this phrase. But the word "Laetare" is the Latin word to "rejoice." And we truly do "rejoice" on this weekend as the Church as we begin to look forward to the paschal mystery, that mystery of Jesus dying and rising, the very means of our salvation. And it is the thought of this salvation that is the cause of our rejoicing on this day. To highlight this attitude of rejoicing the Church relaxes its Lenten discipline, with flowers on the altar and the priest vesting in rose colored vestments. We truly do "rejoice" today as we anticipate the death and resurrection of Jesus who came so that we might have life and life to the fullest.

This Sunday we celebrate the second of our three scrutinies for our Elect, those who are to be baptized at the Easter Vigil. The gospel for this 9:30 Mass is the man who was born blind. In this gospel we experience the conversion story of a man born blind. And what we find is a gradual growth of this young man. He begins by being healed by Jesus. Then we find in this story a person who was not only healed of his physical blindness but a gradual process of being healed from his spiritual blindness. We find this man proclaiming Jesus first to be a miracle worker, then a prophet, and finally when he meets Jesus, proclaiming Jesus to be the Son of Man and ends up worshipping Him. Hopefully for our Elect they too are touched by Jesus' grace and healing, helping us see that Christ is both our Lord and Savior.

For those attending the other Masses, we find St. John in his gospel proclaiming a simple but very profound truth of our faith. He tells us the summary of his gospel when he states: "For God so loved the world that He gave His only Son, so that everyone who believes in Him might not perish but might have eternal life. For God did not send His Son into the world to condemn the world, but that the world might be saved through Him."

On behalf of our parish family, I want to welcome Fr. Mark Tracy who will celebrate two Masses with us this weekend. Since Fr. Zach is at Fr. Mark's parish, Holy Family in Decatur, doing a mission for them, Fr. Mark will take Fr. Zach's place with us. Fr. Tracy is the son of Jil and Jim Tracy.

10% support to the diocesan campaign for the Upon this Rock campaign has been drastically changed


The Diocese of Springfield has announced that the proposed financial support to the Centennial Campaign, as part of the Upon this Rock: The Campaign to Build in Faith at St. Peter campaign, has been adjusted.

Originally set as a commitment of 10% of all campaign funds raised, the Diocese has re-formulated the anticipated support to retain more campaign funds in the campaign and to boost participation in the campaign. The diocesan support in conjunction with the *Upon this Rock* campaign is now estimated to be approximately \$260,000.

In *Upon this Rock* campaign materials, the support for the Centennial Campaign was listed as "IO% of funds raised". The Diocese announced the adjustment after campaign materials were printed.

This change for the support to the *Centennial Campaign* will allow more fundraised dollars to be used for building the cafeteria, the renovation of the current cafeteria to a parish center, and adding new classrooms. However, the diocese is emphasizing keeping support for the parish-level, all while still needing funds to support diocesan projects and programs.
