

The Schedule for Holy Week and Easter Sunday. Please keep in mind that for both Christmas and Easter, all of our churches are on a five-year rotation, so that each of our churches can enjoy the benefit of most favored times for our liturgical celebrations. Those of you who were at the Easter Vigil last year saw a moving celebration with ministries exercised by members of our Youth Group and youth from SHDC. Every church moves "one step over". Here's how things look for the year 2024:

Holy Thursday, ICC, 7:30 p.m. Good Friday, SHDC, 3:00 p.m. Holy Saturday, SHW, 7:30 p.m. Easter Sunday Masses: SMH, 8:00 a.m. SPPN, 10:00 a.m.

Holy Week Confession Schedule Revisited. Because the Chrism Mass is on March 26, and the Triduum begins on March 28, please be aware of the following changes in the Confession schedule for Holy Week. Sunday, March 24, SPPN and ICC, 6-8 p.m. Monday, March 25, SHW and SMH, 6-8 p.m. No Confessions on Tuesday March 26. Wednesday, March 27, SHDC, 6-8 p.m. *Also, before and after weekday Masses.*
