### Fifth Sunday of Lent

### **MARCH 17, 2024**

Jeremiah 31:31-34; Hebrews 5:7-9; John 12:20-33

[There are alternate Biblical texts that may be used for the first and second readings.]

Sixteen centuries ago, there was no special Mass on this Sunday in Rome. All Rome gathered in St. Peter's Basilica on Saturday evening for an all night vigil. At the conclusion of the Vigil, the pope ordained priests, and all celebrated the Eucharist.

This is the background for today's readings. The unifying theme is "priesthood" – not just the ministerial priesthood, but your priesthood by your baptism and confirmation.

The entire Gospel of John is summarized in the prologue: "He came unto his own, and his own received him not...but to as many as received him, he gave the power of becoming children of God."

The first half of John's Gospel is called the "Book of Signs." By seven signs, Jesus replaces the forms and institutions of Judaism with something new and better. (For example, manna is to be replaced by the Eucharist; the Torah is to be replaced by the living water of the Spirit in baptism.) Unfortunately, "his own" did not accept him.

Today's Gospel selection is the climax of the Gospel: "His own" did not receive him, but Gentiles (Greeks) came to him: "To as many as received him, he gave the power to become children of God!" Jesus proclaims that now he is glorified! His priesthood extends to the world.

And what is the essence of that priesthood? It is his self-giving: "Whoever loves his life loses it; whoever hates his life in this world preserves it for life eternal." Our share in Christ's priesthood is to "lose ourselves" in him in the service of others.

The second reading proclaims that Christ was heard because of his obedience. We, too, share in his priesthood when we joyfully accept our crosses.

The first reading, from Jeremiah, proclaims that the new covenant will be written on hearts and not on stone. We are the living stones of the temple of God. Through baptism and confirmation we are called to bring this world to God, and to bring God to the world.

Today we celebrate the third and final Scrutiny.


### Dear Parishioners,

Today the Church celebrates the Fifth Sunday in our season of Lent. During the 9:30 a.m. Mass, we will celebrate the Fifth and last scrutiny for our Elect (unbaptized). It is also during this Mass that we will have the readings from cycle A instead of B, with emphasis upon the resurrection. We find in our first reading in this cycle, words of the prophet Ezekiel, who quotes God as saying, "O my people, I will open your graves and have you rise from them." Is this not our hope? Is this not what Jesus promises for those who are faithful? What a reassuring reading for all of us who have this hope in the resurrection. Finally, in this same cycle, we have our gospel which is the story of the death and burial of Lazarus. It's a beautiful reading which takes the words of the prophet Ezekiel and translates them into Jesus who truly does open up the grave of Lazarus and restores him to life. These readings help us prepare the prayers for our scrutiny today which challenge our Elect to realize that through their baptisms, the thought of death is now only a door that leads to eternal life. Jesus has conquered sin, thereby conquering death, and we now live in the hope that we can share in the life and glory of Christ.

For those of us who will be hearing the Cycle B readings, we are introduced to what is called the Paschal Mystery, namely, Jesus' suffering, death, and resurrection. This is the fundamental mystery of our faith. John introduces this mystery with the image of a grain of wheat. He tells us that "unless a grain of wheat falls to the ground and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat; but if it dies, it produces much fruit." Like the cycle A readings, this image used by Jesus proclaims that death is not the end but a door that opens us to a far greater reality, namely, life with our God in heaven. This is the most glorious fruit gifted to us. We need not fear death, for Jesus Christ has conquered it and given us the hope for a risen life with Him forever. And how is this available to us? Jesus tells us in that same reading, "whoever serves me must follow me, and where I am, there will my servant be." May all of us through our renewal of our baptismal promises, promise to serve the Lord in every aspect of our lives.

Next weekend, the Church will celebrate Palm Sunday and the beginning of Holy Week. For those who have not yet had the opportunity to receive the Sacrament of Reconciliation, there is still time before Easter. There will be a city wide Penance Service next Sunday, March 24, at 2:00 p.m. at Blessed Sacrament Church. There will be a number of priests present for individual confessions. So I challenge you to set this time aside and not wait until the last minute. We will have special designated times on Holy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday morning and these will be in our bulletins for next week.

In this year of the Eucharistic renewal, we are giving our parishioners an opportunity for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament this Sunday from 6:00-7:00 p.m. As you know during the season of Lent, the Church calls for us to pray and there is no greater prayer than in front of the Blessed Sacrament present on our altar. So come as a family and pray as a family before Jesus in the Blessed Sacrament. It will truly be time well spend. For further details, please read the bulletin.
