Passion Sunday (Palm Sunday)

MARCH 24, 2024

(For Palm Procession:

Mark 11:1-10 or John 12: 12-16)
For Mass: Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11;
Mark 14:1-15:47 or Mark 15: 1-39

The double title for today's celebration indicates the basic paradox of our faith: suffering and glory. It is the "Paschal Mystery" of death and resurrection. We enter glory only after apparent defeat.

At the beginning of Mass, we bless palms. Palms (which are not native to Jerusalem) were used on the most glorious and joyous of Jewish feasts to praise the Lord, the King. John's Gospel describes the people of Jerusalem acclaiming Jesus as Messiah and king with palm branches. They shouted, "hosanna," which means, "Save us now!" They wanted to be saved from oppression and from suffering under foreign rulers.

But Jesus was a different kind of Messiah. He saved them not from present ills but from eternal suffering and death. He enters his glory only through the cross.

The readings of Mass tell of the suffering and death of the Lord. The first reading is from the third of four Suffering Servant Songs in Isaiah. The suffering servant is a mysterious "everyman" kind of person who takes all grief and suffering to himself, and by his own suffering vicariously heals all. The primitive Church used these songs as a way of explaining how the Messiah could suffer (since he was supposed to be invincible.)

The second reading was an ancient hymn before Paul ever incorporated it into Philippians (around 58 A.D.) It tells how Christ did not hang on to his equality with the Father, but emptied himself to become one of us. Then he became humbler yet, accepting death on the cross. Therefore he was exalted in the resurrection!

As we listen to the Passion according to Mark, let us identify with the various characters of the story: Are we Peter who talks a good game but who denies the Lord when it really counted. Are we Judas? Are we Pilate, who piously claims innocence when he could have saved Jesus from death. Are we the leaders who preserved their position by getting rid of Jesus?

Palm Sunday, March 24, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Today is Palm Sunday, and the beginning of the most solemn week in our Church year, namely, Holy Week. Right before we bless the Palms for this Mass, we hear the following: *“Brothers and sisters, since the beginning of Lent until now we have prepared our hearts by penance and charitable works. Today we gather together to herald with the whole Church the beginning of the celebration of the Lord’s Paschal Mystery, that is to say, of His Passion and Resurrection. For it was to accomplish this mystery that He entered His own city of Jerusalem. Therefore, with all faith and devotion, let us commemorate the Lord’s entry into the city for our salvation, following in His footsteps, so that, being made by His grace partakers of the Cross, we may have a share also in His Resurrection and in His life. Amen.”*

As we celebrate Holy Week, I draw your attention to celebrations to which you are invited and we hope that you attend. The first celebration is the Chrism Mass which will be celebrated at the Cathedral in Springfield with the Bishop on Tuesday, at 6:30 p.m. At this Mass, the Bishop will bless the oils to be used at all the parishes of the diocese. These oils are the *Oil of the Sick, Oil of Catechumens, and Sacred Chrism*. A representative from the parish will bring these oils back to us for our use here at St. Peter.

Then I draw your attention to the Triduum, the three holiest days in our Church year. On Holy Thursday, March 28, there will only be one Mass on that day at **7:00 p.m.** It is this day that we celebrate the Evening Mass of the Lord’s Last Supper. Upon completion of this Mass, the sanctuary is stripped, and we are encouraged to adore the Blessed Sacrament for a suitable period of time during the night. In order for us to be assured of someone present, I am asking if people whose last names begin with the following letters, be present at those times:

8:15-9:15 p.m., J-K, Sts. Alive; 9:15-10:15 p.m. R-Z, Found;

10:15-11:15 p.m. A-I, High School and College students.

The second day of our Holy Triduum is Friday, March 29, with the celebration of the Lord’s Passion and Holy Communion. This celebration will take place at **7:00 p.m.**

Finally, the third day of our Triduum is Saturday, March 30, with the celebration of the Easter Vigil at **8:00 p.m.** Our celebration of the liturgy that night reflects the fullness of the Church coming alive in liturgy. We will be celebrating our Elect receiving the Sacraments of Initiation as well as those others, who have been baptized, being received into full communion in the Church. This Mass which is so rich in meaning is the welcoming of Easter in the midst of our liturgy. Please join us and experience the rich depth of this celebration of Easter.

Then on Sunday, March 31 we will be celebrating Easter and the Lord’s Resurrection from the dead. Our Masses that morning will be at **8:00, 9:30, and 11:00 a.m.** We welcome all of you to this celebration of joy, and hope that you continue to return and celebrate this new life with us in the Eucharist.
