

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:

Alleluia Alleluia



Welcome to parishioners, family, friends, visitors, and all who come to worship with us on this most glorious feast of the Resurrection of the Lord! May the light of the Risen Lord shine upon you this day, and all the days of your life, that he may find you ready to enter into the splendor of his kingdom when he comes in glory.

Thank you to all who have made this celebration on Easter special—parishioners, our musicians, liturgical ministers, parish staff, church decorators, sacristans. The many people who make these celebrations possible reflect the glory of the members of the Mystical Body of Christ working together to give praise to God Father in union with the Holy Spirit.

As a parish community, we are diminished by the absence of those who have been baptized into the Body of Christ when they find themselves unable to join us due to sickness, or old age, by past hurts at the hands of the Church or its people, or simply by the distraction by

the competing goods of this world. As your pastor, I ask you to continue to help me by bringing to my attention, or the attention of our parish staff, those opportunities that will help us as a parish be more effective in our outreach and reconciliation with those who have fallen away or grown lukewarm in their faith. The work of proclaiming and living God's mercy advances our core purpose given by the Great Commission to teach and preach to all peoples and places. We pray and work everyday to gather our parishioners and equip them to live the faith boldly by assuming their rightful place among God's Holy People engaged in worship, study, fellowship, service, and growth.



The season of Easter is marked by fifty days of feasting and celebration, which contrasts to the forty days of Lenten penance and sacrifice. We see some of the greatest crowds of the year at Church on Ash Wednesday— I have always suspected that this is because the themes of the Ash Wednesday resonate profoundly with our human experience. We know our failures. We have some level of desire to change our ways. We need the words of mercy from a God who has the power to heal and forgive. This

effort demands introspection, repentance and conversion. For most, there is also some degree of suffering to purge the forces of evil that beset us. But the effort and gift of making a good Lent enables us to celebrate Easter with a new spiritual energy and intensity.

But now that the time of Lent is over, it is time to fill the Easter season with the joy of living "in the freedom of the children of God" (cf Romans 8: 19ff). Ours is a freedom that does not glorify licentiousness and over-indulgence, but of living in right-relationship with the world, with each other, and with God. In the glory of the Resurrection we see the flip-side of Lent. The effects of God's Grace and mercy abound as those who were once bowed down are now raised up. Faith need not be an unreachable, insurmountable goal in the spiritual life, but it is made real by knowing God's Divine Mercy. In the coming weeks, we will hear these truths proclaimed from the letters of St. John in our second readings at Sunday Mass. We will hear how God's mercy completely changed the lives of St. Paul and the other apostles. We will see how the disciples interacted with the Risen Lord, who does not wish them to live in fear and ignorance, but to grow in faith and know the love of the Father. Next week we celebrate the Sunday of Divine Mercy, which reminds us that the disciplines of Lent are not ends to themselves, but prepare us to have greater faith and come to know the heart of God more perfectly. Like Lent, Easter is a season of sustained celebration in order to internalize its message: "We are an Easter People and Alleluia is our song." Make the most of it and enjoy your chocolates and Friday evening steaks, but most of all, live into that freedom of the Children of God, whose sins are forgiven and whose destiny lies in heaven.


