FROM THE DESK OF FATHER SAIKI

Dear Brothers and Sisters,

Next weekend our second graders and other students will be celebrating the First Holy Communion. We will be offering the First Communions at the 10:00 a.m. Mass and the 12:00 p.m. Mass. It is always so beautiful to see our young people receive Jesus in that powerful way for the first time. I always recall my own First Communion. I remember being nervous, and trying to be sure to sit in the right place, and to stand up and approach the priest at the right time. Despite all my nerves that day, I remember it all fading away when I finally received Communion. I remember feeling God in such a powerful way, and I was overwhelmed that I was receiving His Body and Blood, Soul and Divinity. While I only had the understanding of a second grader, and the word “transubstantiation” was not very clear to me yet, I knew without a doubt that I was receiving God.

I still get overwhelmed by the reality of the Eucharist, that God would make Himself so totally available to us, for us, whenever we seek Him. Unlike baptism or confirmation, we receive the Eucharist over and over again, to renew and maintain our connection and relationship with the Lord, to have the nourishment of that spiritual food to sustain us on our journey. God offers us the entirety of Himself each day, each week so we might be one with Him.

Because of God’s immense generosity and total availability, we can so easily take this gift of the Eucharist for granted. We can so easily fall into a routine mechanical reception and forget the magnitude of receiving the Eucharist. When I was ordained a priest, someone gifted me a card that read, “Priest of God, offer this Mass as if it your first Mass, your last Mass, your only Mass”. That pious reminder has always helped me to focus at Mass, and to not let my presiding at Mass become routine. I think an adaptation of that sentiment might be helpful for us in our preparation to receive Holy Communion. “Child of God, receive this Holy Communion as if it your First Holy Communion, your Last Holy Communion, your only Holy Communion”. If we treat each encounter with Our Eucharistic Lord as singular and unique, and we prepare accordingly, we can better dispose ourselves for Him and His graces, and be sure we are ready to receive Him. We will hopefully show Him more reverence and love. We will not take Him or the Blessed Sacrament for granted, but we will treat it as the most precious gift we have, Jesus uniting Himself to us.

Our ability to receive Our Lord in Holy Communion is such a precious gift. It is such an amazing encounter. I hope and pray that we all deepen our belief, our love, our reverence, our wonder and awe for such an amazing gift! I hope and pray we never take Him for granted, but deepen our communion with Him each time we receive Him and His real presence in the Holy Eucharist.

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas,

El próximo fin de semana nuestros alumnos de segundo grado y otros estudiantes celebrarán la Primera Comunión. Ofreceremos las Primeras Comuniones en la Misa de las 10:00am y en la Misa de las 12:00pm. Siempre es tan hermoso ver a nuestros jóvenes recibir a Jesús de esa manera poderosa por primera vez. Siempre recuerdo mi propia Primera Comunión. Recuerdo estar nervioso y tratar de asegurarme de sentarme en el lugar correcto, levantarme y acercarme al sacerdote en el momento adecuado. A pesar de todos mis nervios ese día, recuerdo que todo se desvaneció cuando finalmente recibí la Comunión. Recuerdo sentir que Dios de una manera tan poderosa, y me sentí abrumado de estar recibiendo Su Cuerpo y Sangre, Alma y Divinidad. Si bien solo tenía la comprensión de un niño de segundo grado y la palabra “transustanciación” aún no me resultaba muy clara, sabía sin cualquier duda que estaba recibiendo Dios.

Todavía me siento abrumado por la realidad de la Eucaristía, que Dios se haría totalmente disponible para nosotros, siempre que lo busquemos. A diferencia del bautismo o la confirmación, recibimos la Eucaristía una y otra vez, para renovar y mantener nuestra conexión y relación con el Señor, para tener ese alimento espiritual que nos sostiene en nuestro camino. Dios nos ofrece la totalidad de Él mismo cada día, cada semana para que podamos ser uno con Él.

Debido a la inmensa generosidad y total disponibilidad de Dios, podemos fácilmente dar por sentado este regalo de la Eucaristía. Podemos caer muy fácilmente en una recepción mecánica rutinaria y olvidar la magnitud de recibir la Eucaristía. Cuando fui ordenado sacerdote, alguien me regaló una tarjeta que decía: “Sacerdote de Dios, ofrece esta Misa como si fuera tu primera Misa, tu última Misa, tu única Misa”. Ese piadoso recordatorio siempre me ha ayudado a concentrarme en la Misa y a no permitir que presidir la Misa se convierta en una rutina. Creo que una adaptación de ese sentimiento podría ser útil para nosotros en nuestra preparación para recibir la Sagrada Comunión. “Hijo de Dios, recibe esta Sagrada Comunión como si fuera tu Primera Comunión, tu Última Comunión, tu única Comunión”. Si tratamos cada encuentro con Nuestro Señor Eucarístico como singular y único, y nos preparamos en consecuencia, podremos disponernos mejor para Él y Sus gracias, y estar seguros de que estamos listos para recibirlo. Le mostraremos más reverencia y amor. No lo daremos por sentado ni a Él ni al Santísimo Sacramento, sino que lo trataremos como el regalo más precioso que tenemos: Jesús uniéndose a nosotros.

Nuestra capacidad de recibir a Nuestro Señor en la Sagrada Comunión es un regalo muy precioso. Es un encuentro tan asombroso. ¡Espero y rezo para que todos profundicemos nuestra creencia, nuestro amor, nuestra reverencia, nuestro asombro por un regalo tan maravilloso! Espero y rezo para que nunca lo demos por sentado, sino que profundicemos nuestra comunión con Él cada vez que lo recibimos y Su presencia real en la Sagrada Eucaristía.

PRAYER ON ANNIVERSARY OF KS SUPREME COURT DECISION

April 26 is the anniversary of the Hodes & Nauser MDs vs. Schmidt Kansas Supreme Court decision. Please share the following with your parishioners to create awareness and also consider providing a communal prayer opportunity with the suggestions below. The Kansas Constitution begins by giving thanks to "Almighty God for our civil and religious privileges." It then says: "All men are possessed of equal and inalienable natural rights, among which are "life, liberty, and the pursuit of happiness."

On April 26, 2019, the Kansas Supreme Court held in Hodes & Nauser MDs v. Schmidt that these words protect a supposed "natural right" to abortion. Join Archbishop Naumann in praying for an end to the supposed "natural right" to abortion in our state and a conversion of hearts so that Life might once again be protected as was intended by our forefathers. In reparation for the harms against the unborn, expectant women and families, we encourage parishes to offer an opportunity for prayer. Communal prayer could be in the form of:

- . A holy hour with adoration
- . The recitation of the Divine Mercy Chaplet either in the church or adoration chapel, or if that is not possible, to be done individually, preferable at the mercy hour of 3:00 p.m.
- . A Rosary

ORACION EN ANIVERSARIO DE LA DECISION DE LA CORTE SUPREMA

El 26 de abril es el aniversario de la decisión de la Corte Suprema de Kansas sobre Hodes & Nauser MDs vs. Schmidt. En reparación por los daños sufridos por los no nacidos, las mujeres embarazadas y las familias, animamos a las parroquias a ofrecer una oportunidad de oración. La oración comunitaria podría realizarse en forma de:

- Una hora santa con adoración
- El rezo de la Coronilla de la Divina Misericordia ya sea en la iglesia o capilla de adoración, o si no es posible, se hará de forma individual, preferentemente a la hora de la misericordia de las 3:00 p.m.
