

The decorations of our churches; the music offered in worship at our Masses and Liturgies, from Palm Sunday, all the way through Easter Sunday; the ministry and availability of our deacons, our servers, our lectors, and all those who saw to the attention to details so important for Holy Week and the Easter Triduum; the ministry of pastoral care, preaching, teaching, and presiding at our Masses on the part of Fr. James: so much for which to be thankful during this Easter season! Our parishioners and visitors filled our churches throughout Palm Sunday and the Easter Triduum, into Easter Sunday morning; our gratitude and appreciation go out to *you*, for your faith and generosity in support of the cause of our Churches, and your relationship to Jesus Christ!

Divine Mercy Sunday. In the Catholic Church, Easter is a week-long day, concluding with the Sunday after Easter, Divine Mercy Sunday. The Divine Mercy Image of Jesus, the Chaplet, and the Hour of Mercy are the highlights of this devotion, which has brought about many conversions, miracles, and closeness to Jesus and His Church. We will have two Divine Mercy Holy Hours this Sunday, April 7, from 3 to 4 p.m. One will be at Sacred Heart Church in Warsaw; the other will be in Sacred Heart Church, Dallas City. All are encouraged to participate in this hour of grace promised to us by the Lord Himself, through His words to St. Faustina, through whom the Divine Mercy message and devotion has spread worldwide, since the early 1930's.

You Have Been Baptized in Jesus Christ! You Have Been Sealed With the Gift of the Holy Spirit! Our welcome, prayers, and congratulations to those who entered into the fullness of the Catholic faith at the Easter Vigil: Moriah Jo Vollbracht, who received the Sacraments of Initiation; Linda Bishop Gnann, who received the Sacraments of Initiation (Linda was already baptized, but because exact information was not recorded, the Catholic Church, as a safeguard and provision for sacramental records, provides what we call "Conditional Baptism"); Charles David Newman, who made Profession of Faith, and received Confirmation and First Eucharist; and Peyton Joseph Mudd, who completed his Catholic Baptism by receiving the sacrament of Confirmation. Anyone who hasn't been to an Easter Vigil yet? Because it's...long? You're missing a liturgy that presents the entirety of the Catholic faith, in one evening! Hope to see you next year, at the Easter Vigil!
