
- INSIGHTS OF ST. JOHN CLIMACUS

- Chaplain's Reflection...

I will long remember approaching a striking sculpture in the lower level of the Louvre Museum in Paris. It was a marble statue by Michelangelo entitled "The Dying Slave." To be able to be there right next to such a priceless work of art by one of history's greatest artists was breathtaking.



I stood there for some time in amazement that something so beautiful could be carved from a block of stone, tiny chips painstakingly cut from a block

of marble with hammer and chisel. A careless slip of the hand and the entire piece would have been ruined!

As I studied the work I noticed that it appeared to be unfinished. Glancing at the base of the statue, I could see the figure appeared to be emerging, crawling out of the raw marble block from which it was being carved.

One of the sculptor's greatest creations, this statue has been said to be unfinished by some scholars, while others claim that its appearance symbolizes man's struggle for freedom or salvation from the bounds of this world.

In a sense this statue stands for every man, and our deepest desire for transcendence. That journey of life was described so well by the poet Rainer Rilke: *God speaks to each of us as he makes us, then walks with us silently out of the night. These are the words we dimly hear: You, sent out beyond your recall, go to the limits of your longing. Embody me. Flare up like a flame and make big shadows I can move in. Let everything happen to you: beauty and terror. Just keep going. No feeling is final. Don't let yourself lose me. Nearby is the country they call life. You will know it by its seriousness. Give me your hand.*

Sister Lucia, one of the Fatima visionaries, wrote: "Our Lady insists on our persevering in prayer. It is not enough to pray once in a while; we must pray always, that is, every day, with faith and confidence." St. Paul said much the same thing in his first letter to the Thessalonians: *Pray without ceasing. In all circumstances give thanks, for this is the will of God for you in Christ Jesus.* (1 Thes 5:17-18)

Why must we "pray without ceasing?" Well - for the same reason that a great sculptor must concentrate his whole being on his chisel - so that he

achieves the right motion, forming the stone into a work of art.

When he is distracted he risks ruining the whole work! As Jesus instructed us: *Be vigilant at all times and pray that you have the strength to escape the tribulations that are imminent and to stand before the Son of Man.* (Luke 21:36)

We might imagine our lives as being like that statue emerging from a great block of marble. As we hold God's hand, he ever so slowly chips away the stone of our lives, forming us. It is the work of our lifetime, an effort of love. We are God's masterpieces. We help Him most if we allow him to hold our hand in prayer.
