Pentecost Sunday

MAY 19, 2024

Acts 2:1-11; 1 Corinthians 12:3b-7,12-13 or Galatians 5: 16-25; John 20:19-23 or John 15: 26-27; 16: 12-15

The word "pentecostes" means "fiftieth." It was a Jewish festival of the ingathering of the harvest fifty days after Passover; it became a festival of covenant renewal also.

In the Exodus, the Hebrews arrived at Mt. Sinai fifty days after their departure from Egypt. There they received the Torah and they made their covenant with God. This was accompanied by signs of fire and quaking.

Fifty days after Easter (our Christian Passover), the Holy Spirit comes in power to ratify the new covenant. The new covenant is not restricted to the blood descendants of Abraham; it is for everyone of every nation.

The Spirit gives a variety of gifts and ministries in the Church, but all gifts are for the building up of the Church in the unity of truth and of love.

In the Gospel, Jesus confers the Holy Spirit on the apostles as a sign that he sends them forth, just as he had been sent forth from the Father. As he came to forgive and to reconcile, so he sends them to do the same things.

The Holy Spirit is the life of the Church; let us resolve to live this life perfectly and to be faithful witnesses of the Lord to this world.

After the second reading of today's Mass, we sing the "Sequence." This sequence, the "Veni Sancte Spiritus" (Come, Holy Spirit) is also called the "Golden Sequence." It is one of the most beautiful pieces of Gregorian Chant. Only two days in the Church Year (Easter and Pentecost) have "sequences."

Dear Parishioners.

Today we celebrate the great solemnity of Pentecost, when the Holy Spirit came upon Jesus' disciples with a mighty wind and tongues of fire. With this promised gift, the Church takes birth and according to the Acts of the Apostles burst forth from that room and began preaching the gospel. And in spite of the diversity of languages in those who listened, all were able to understand them as "they heard them speaking in their own languages of the mighty acts of God." With this image of people hearing the apostles speaking in different languages, we recall the story of the tower of Babel. In that story, we recall humankind building a structure "with its tower in the tip of the sky and so make a name for ourselves." Then as the reading tells us, God confuses the language of the people, so "that no one will be able to understand what another says." Now with Pentecost, the confusion of languages is no longer a barrier to unity, as the apostles spoke in the languages of the people and they understood. What was a source of disunity, is now a source of unity, being united in the one faith and one Spirit of God. "Come Holy Spirt fill the lives of your faithful and enkindle in them the fire of your love."

Next Saturday, May 25, Bishop Paporcki will be ordaining five men to the priesthood at the Cathedral in Springfield. On behalf of St. Peter Parish family, I want to congratulate the following men on their vocation and welcome them into our priestly brotherhood: Rev. Troy Niemerg, Rev. Alex McCullough, Rev. Daniel McGrath, Rev. Bruce Scott, and Rev. Jayke White. Last summer we had the experience of helping form Deacon Jayke White into the priest that he will become. For both Fr. Zach and I to be able to attend and concelebrate this ordination Mass, we will not be having Saturday morning Mass, nor Saturday morning and afternoon confessions. This will give us an opportunity to get to Springfield for this ordination. Then on Sunday, May 26, Fr. Zach and myself have been invited to attend Fr. Jayke White's first Mass at St. Boniface Church, Edwardsville, Illinois. Fortunately, Fr. Mike Kuse was willing to cover our last two Sunday Masses for that day so that we can attend this first Mass. Just as a side note, Fr. Jayke White desired to come to St. Peter Church to celebrate Mass with us and for us. So he will be with us on the weekend of June 15-16. We will plan on having a reception for him in order for parishioners to have an opportunity to visit with him and congratulate him.

On behalf of our parish family, I want to congratulate Fr. Don Blickhan, a Quincy native and a retired priest of our diocese, who is celebrating his golden anniversary as a priest. Fifty years of dedicated ministry—Congratulations, Fr. Don Blickhan. Our prayers are with you. Fr. Don was a year ahead of me in the seminary formation and I too congratulate him.

As we look ahead, Memorial Day is on Monday, May 27. Instead of having a daily Mass on that day, we've had a concelebrated Mass at Calvary Cemetery as we gather to pray for the deceased. This Mass will be at 9:00 a.m.. In case of rain, it will be at 9:30 at St. Anthony Church. Please bring your lawn chairs, blankets, and celebrate the Eucharist with us. I also remind you that we continue to need support of our cemeteries. There are special envelopes to be used in your packets—just place them in the collection basket at Mass. Thanks!
