## Solemnity of the Most Holy Trinity

MAY 26, 2024

Deuteronomy 4:32-34,39-40; Romans 8:14-17; Matthew 28:16-20

Our Scripture readings today were probably selected in order to show how our God differs from the "gods" of other religions. The readings also show how the Mystery of the Trinity responds to these wonderful attributes of God.

The gods and goddesses of other religions are capricious; you never know quite how they will act. They have to be placated or they will turn against you. You have to merit their favor. They almost act as if you are in competition with them, for they don't want you to share their eternal life.

How very different is our God! God speaks to us a saving message: He loves us even when we fail him. He calls us to share eternal life. He is not a "local" god, but is Lord of all creation. Our God is close to us – so close that we could even call him "Dad" (for that is what the Aramaic word "Abba" means!) In and through Jesus, the Son of God, we become heirs of heaven. God lives in our hearts by his Holy Spirit.

Even though we believe in the warmth and nearness of God, he may still seem far off to us. No one has seen the Father, but Jesus says that if we have seen him, we have seen the Father!

Now we know the Father in the person of Jesus. But for us who live 2,000 years after Jesus lived, it is even hard to know the Son. For this reason, the Lord has sent the Holy Spirit into our hearts to make us one in the Son.

Jesus is our Mediator, our Intercessor, and our "Advocate" ("Paraclete") at the right hand of the Father. The Holy Spirit is our "Advocate" ("Paraclete"), our Guide and our Comforter here on earth. Our entire faith life should be "Trinitarian." Let us give glory to the Father through the Son in the Holy Spirit with the Blessed Virgin Mary and all the saints!

# The Parish of St. Peter Quincy, IL

The Most Holy Trinity Solemnity, May 26, 2024

#### Dear Parishioners,

With the closing of the Easter season with the Solemnity of Pentecost, the Church returns to what is called "Ordinary Time." According to the "Ordo" which guides our liturgy, this time is called "ordinary" because "there is no particular aspect of the mystery of Christ that is celebrated, but rather the mystery of Christ is honored in its fullness." The color of "Ordinary Time" is green which depicts hope, growth, increase, life, immortality, and fidelity. However, yes, we begin "Ordinary Time" but the two Sundays after Pentecost celebrate two important doctrines of our faith. This Sunday we celebrate Trinity Sunday, the most fundamental doctrine of the Catholic Church; and next Sunday, we celebrate what was originally called Corpus Christi, or the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ. The weekdays remain "ordinary time:" whereas we pick up this time called "ordinary" in two weeks.

Today as I stated, we celebrate the Solemnity of the Trinity. This mystery, which is beyond our comprehension, states these fundamental truths: 1. The Father, Son, and Holy Spirit are one and the same God; 2. The divine persons are distinct from one another; 3. The purpose of the divine missions of the Son and the Holy Spirit is to bring us to share in the life, light, and love of the Trinity. Perhaps the one symbol that is at the very root of this doctrine, the one gesture that we use so often, is that sign of the cross. The next time we use this gesture, let's think deeply about our basic belief in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit. Amen.

This Monday is Memorial Day, and we are invited with the community of Quincy to celebrate a Mass of Remembrance at Calvary Cemetery at 9:00 a.m. Please bring a chair or blanket for your use. The Mass will be celebrated at the Memorial Chapel at Calvary. In case of rain, Mass will be transferred to St. Anthony Church at 9:30 a.m. If you get bothered by those little black bugs, as I do, you might want to put on some "Buggins" or other sprays to keep them away. As we celebrate Memorial Day, I invite you to consider a donation to the cemetery. Yes, I know there is what is termed Perpetual Care, and that covers the maintenance of the Cemeteries, but if we were to add a road, remove a tree, or open a new section, these costs go far beyond our Perpetual Care. So this is where you donation assists the directors as we continue to make improvements in the appearance of our three cemeteries, St. Boniface, St. Peter, and Calvary. Envelopes for this collection are found in your packet of parish envelopes. Just put these in the collection basket at weekend Masses.

On behalf of our parish family, I want to congratulate Fr. Jayke White on his ordination to the priesthood at the Cathedral on Saturday, May 25. We are so proud of him and thank God that we had an opportunity to help him in his formation process by his ministry as a deacon last summer. His first appointment in our diocese is to be the parochial vicar at St. Anthony Church, Effingham, Illinois. Please keep him in your prayers.






