

### The Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ.

I regret that we cannot have a Eucharistic procession outdoors this weekend; in the past, we concluded all of our Masses with an outdoor display of our faith in the presence of Jesus - Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity - in the Holy Eucharist. We hope to do this in the coming years. In the meantime, add this up, why don't you? The blood on the cloth believed to cover the face of Jesus in His death and burial; the corporal showing the blood that came from a Sacred Host that bled, in the face of an unbelieving priest; and the blood found on the Shroud of Turin: they all have the same blood type, as well as evidence of parts of Jesus' body - I mean, even evidence of a portion of His Sacred Heart. The glorified body of Jesus Christ came from the womb of the Virgin Mary. And modern science demonstrates the presence of children's cells still enshrined in the bodies of their mothers. Do you "see" how real our union with Jesus is in the reception of Holy Communion? And how true it is that in the order of grace, Mother is actually our Mother, too, by God's design? Who'd want to do without this?!!!

Growing Disciples Update. Due to the Memorial Day weekend, we have not yet set up the meetings necessary to listen to and discuss with our parishioners the aftermath and consequences of the decisions rendered by Growing Disciples. Priority goes to Sacred Heart Church in Dallas City and St. Mary Church in Hamilton. We also intend to have budget formulation work sessions with Finance Council members for each of our churches. And our Finance Council meetings will include a "Town Meeting" format, for the long-awaited opportunity to listen to questions and comments from parishioners of each of our churches. Our Dallas City and Hamilton meetings will be scheduled quickly, and communicated via callout.

Please keep in mind, everyone: the beginning of implementation of Growing Disciples decisions is July 1. *This is not a deadline for completion; it's a beginning date for the work of implementation.* This is going to include parishioner representation and a period of two years. And we still need to hear from the Diocese about guidelines for our buildings, our religious objects, and the daunting prospect of a unified budget. This is - every bit of it - going to take a while. We'll keep you posted, as best we can. Comments, concerns, complaints, suggestions, objections: I realize I have to listen. I full-well realize that I have to take responsibility for any oversights and mistakes. If you feel like you have to say something...anything...don't be shy. I'm here. Fr. T.
