Solemnity of the Body and Blood of Christ

JUNE 2, 2024

Exodus 24:3-8; Hebrews 9:11-15; Mark 14:12-16,22-26

The "Mystery" of the Eucharist can be considered in many ways. We could consider the "Real Presence;" the risen Christ is present under the appearances of bread and wine; after the consecration of Mass, nothing remains of the bread and wine except "accidental appearances;" the reality is Jesus Christ!

We could consider the Eucharist from the aspect of "Sacrifice." Each and every Mass is a renewal or re-presentation of the sacrifice of Jesus Christ. He does not suffer or die, for he did that once and for all. But he renews the offering of himself to his Father in our behalf.

We could consider the Eucharist as "Sacrament." Jesus Christ comes to us under appearances of bread and wine in order that we may share his life; he comes to enable us to rise above the natural and the human to the divine.

Today's Mass, however, emphasizes the Eucharist as our "Covenant." A covenant is an agreement between two unequal parties, freely entered into, binding perpetually, and sealed in blood. The Hebrews borrowed the covenant concept from their pagan neighbors in order to describe their unique relationship with God. Pagan covenants were between emperors and vassals or between kings and nobles; but the Hebrew covenant was between God and his people.

The first reading of Mass describes the covenant which Moses made with God on Mt. Sinai. God's part of the agreement is to make his people a kingdom of priests, a holy nation, a people dearer to him than all others. Israel's part of the agreement was to keep God's law: "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." The covenant was ratified by sacrifice.

At the Last Supper, Jesus begins the new covenant which he will complete in his sacrificial death. Jesus borrows the words of Moses when he changes bread and wine into his Body and Blood. He makes the Eucharist the means of our covenant renewal.

If our covenant renewal is genuine, we must proclaim – in every Mass – "We will do everything that the Lord has told us." If we are faithful to our covenant, God will be faithful in making us a holy people, dearer to him than all others.

The Most Holy Body & Blood of Christ Solemnity, June 2, 2024 Dear Parishioners,


This weekend we celebrate the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Traditionally in the Church this Solemnity was called Corpus Christi (Latin for Body of Christ) and was celebrated on the Thursday after Trinity Sunday. In the universal Church this celebration is a Holyday of Obligation. But in the United States where this Solemnity was not celebrated as a Holyday, the Bishops transferred this Solemnity to the Sunday after Trinity Sunday thus making it a Holyday of Obligation for Catholics.

This Solemnity identifies us as a Eucharistic People, a people for whom the Eucharist becomes our perfect form of worship. We no longer offer the sacrifices of animals, but rather our sacrifices is the very Lamb of God who offered His life on the cross for all of us. Thus, there is no greater worship than to unite ourselves each and every Sunday to the sacrifices offered for all of us by Jesus Himself. This Solemnity identifies us as a Eucharistic People, a people who, through the priest, make present on our altar the very Body and Blood of Christ, the spiritual food for our journey here on earth. As Jesus would say in St. John's Gospel, "unless you eat the flesh of the Son of Man and drink His blood, you do not have life within you." The Eucharist is the food that gives us that life.

Because the Eucharist is who we are and what we are about, we are challenging our parish families to return to the celebration of it by making the Eucharist each Sunday a priority. This challenge has been extended especially to our families who have students at St. Peter School. In fact, any student present in the Catholic schools of Quincy must sign this letter of agreement. Each parish that has a school is encouraging and challenging their families to reaffirm their Catholic faith and make themselves and their families present at the Eucharist each Sunday. In this family school agreement which begins July 1, 2024, these families are acknowledging that the Eucharist is fundamental to our lives as Catholics, thus agreeing to be present at a Catholic Mass on the weekends. If these families fulfill this agreement, then the parish will subsidize their tuition the following year. If not, then they are choosing to pay the tuition without the parish support the following year. Unfortunately, we have to have a means of accountability so that we know if the agreement is being followed. I don't like doing this, but there is also a matter of justice for the parish who subsidizes our school for people who are active parishioners. And so there is a color coded ticket system that will be used for our parish school families. This is not meant to be a punishment but rather as a call to come back to the Eucharist which is so central to our Catholic life. Every parish that has a school in Quincy will be participating.

This next week, many of the priests of the diocese will be attending the annual priest's retreat north of Peoria. Since I was at St. Meinrad's and made my own private retreat, I will not be going there but will remain in Quincy. Fr. Zach will be on a different private retreat this next week. I ask your prayers for him and for all the priests, that they will continue to grow in their ministry in the Church and their love of God in their lives. Reminder that Fr. Jayke White will be with us on the weekend of June 15-16 to celebrate Masses with us.



During the last several weeks of May, most of our priests of our diocese were reflecting upon their anniversary of ordination and first Masses. I know that Fr. Zach celebrated his second anniversary of ordination on Tuesday, May 28; and I celebrated by 49th year of ordination on Friday, May 31. What keeps us both going are your prayers, your love, and your support. Thanks for always being there for us.

Unfortunately, we have encountered some hazards that have to be addressed in our gym. I needed to quickly move on this while I could get the proper people in to address the issue that we were having. What we thought was dirt in the rubber flooring was actually some type of mercury that was used when they laid the floor 40 years ago. As long as it remained untouched, there was no problem. But I didn't want this to ever be an issue around our kids. So in short, we will have to abate this flooring and then install a new gym floor. Needless to say, this was not planned in our budget. But I got all the permissions necessary from the diocese and work will hopefully be done in July. In our time of capital campaign, this was not expected.
