

Father's Day.

My Grandfather on my Dad's side, Stipan Troselj (Stephen Trosley on this side of Ellis Island!) lived well into his nineties. In the last years of his life, my Dad would frequently visit him and take care of him. "Dida," as we called Grandpa, was on the decline, and would tell Dad about his life. Dad talked to me one day about those visits. His face looked radiant, as if he had seen a vision. Dida had told him things Dad had never known before. How he laid railroad tracks across the Northwestern and Southern States; how he had been a logger; what life was like at home in what is now Croatia: Dad was like a child, beaming as he talked with pride and amazement about the things his Dad did in life. Dida died in the early 1970"s; that means that Dad was listening to him in his early 50's. Still a child, when it came to the pride stored in his heart for his Dad. On this Father's Day, Dads, remember that you're still a child, too. Show your kids how proud you are of yours - let them see your face when you relate the good things you remember about him. They'll remember you for that; and one day, they'll be talking about you, too. And it will show, all over their faces. Fr. T.
