# Eleventh Sunday in Ordinary Time

**JUNE 16, 2024** 

Ezekiel 17:22-24; 2 Corinthians 5:6-10; Mark 4:26-34

"Tree" was an ancient metaphor for "empire" or "kingdom." Little peoples and small nations could find protection under the branches of the "big tree," the kingdom or empire.

In today's first reading, Ezekiel looks forward to the restoration of the kingdom of Israel. Ezekiel was a prophet when Israel had been destroyed and its people were captives in Babylon.

The Church sees in the reading another meaning: The new tree of Israel is a symbol of the new kingdom of God, the Church. The Church will come from small beginnings (like a tender branch from the topmost branch of a tree).

The Gospel echoes this theme: The mustard seed is very small, just as the kingdom of God appeared very small on Pentecost. We don't see the growth of a tree; in a similar way, we don't always see the growth of the kingdom of God.

Sometimes we are very impatient and discouraged at the slow pace of the Church's growth. But the tree will grow by God's power. It will become so great that the birds of the air will nest in its branches.

"Birds of the air" is another metaphor, one used by the rabbis for "Gentiles." All the nations will come to the kingdom – if we invite them, if we pray for them, and if we are worthy witnesses of the kingdom of God.

#### Dear Parishioners,

On this third weekend in our month of June, the Church celebrates the 11th Sunday in Ordinary Time. This weekend I would like to highlight our second reading for this weekend, a reading from Paul's letter to the Corinthians. The words of St. Paul offered to the Corinthians also provide much food for thought for all of us. Paul reminds the Corinthians and us, that our true home, the place for which we long, the hope for which we have, is not in this world of ours as we know it. Our Creator has created us for Him and it is in His life that we find our purpose, meaning, and life eternal. And so, as we dwell in this temporary world, "we are courageous for we know that while we are at home in the body, we are away from the Lord." These words are not necessarily what we like to hear as it forces us to deal with being finite, that our lives some day will come to an end. But as we are away from the Lord, Paul tells us that we are to "walk by faith, not by sight." Our faith is fundamental to us as we try to make sense out of this journey here on earth being away from the God who loves us. And as we do, Paul tells us about a reality for which we always do not like to face, namely, "going home to the Lord in death." None of us enjoys facing this reality because we have this fear of the unknown. But as we try our best to walk in faith, you and I are called to "aspire to please our God, whether we are at home or away. For we must all appear before the judgement seat of Christ, so that each of us may receive recompense, according to what he/she did in the body, whether good or evil." This is not meant to scare us but only to help us place our lives in the proper perspective. That we are created by a God who loves us, redeemed by a God who wants us to share in His life, and made holy by a God who desires us to live with Him forever. May these beautiful words of Paul ring true for all of us.

This weekend we want to welcome back to St. Peter Church, Fr. Jayke White, one of our newly ordained priests for our diocese. Fr. Jayke is here to celebrate Mass with us and for us as we assisted him last summer in his diaconate formation. We congratulate him and assure him of our prayers as he begins his new role as a priest in the Springfield in Illinois diocese. Fr. Jayke has been assigned as of July 1, to be the parochial vicar at St. Anthony Church, Effingham, Illinois. Please join us after our Masses on Sunday for a coffee and donut reception for Fr. Jayke in the cafeteria.

Also, next Sunday, June 23, we will be having a reception for Fr. Zach Samples in the cafeteria from 12:00 Noon to 3:00 p.m. I hope that many of you will reserve this time to come by, and to thank Fr. Zach for his service to our parish. As you should know, Fr. Zach has been transferred to St. Agnes Church, Springfield, where he will assume his role as parochial vicar, along with also being named Chaplain at Sacred Heart Griffin High School, along with a special role in the work for more vocations. His new assignment also begins July 1. Please keep him in your prayers as transitions for priests are always difficult.






