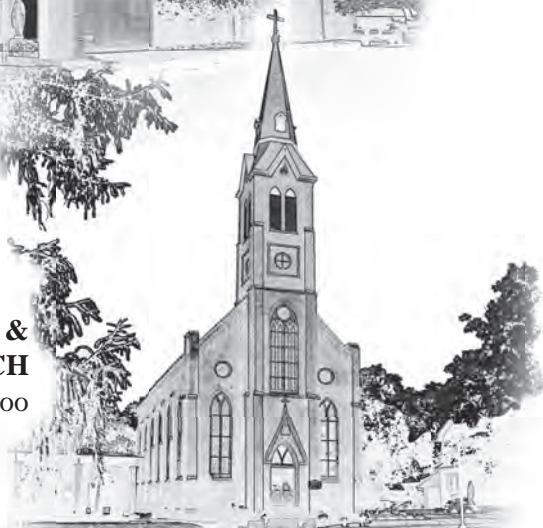

As Convention and Election Days Draw Near.

Our reminder is constant, and it will be: you will be reading direct quotes from the Catechism of the Catholic Church on pertinent topics affecting our vote on election day in November. There will be no emphasis, no editorial comment, no "hidden messages" of any kind; there will only be what the Catholic Church teaches. We understand the dilemma Catholic voters have faced in recent elections. For example: to the Catholic Church, abortion is the issue rising above, and not to be compared with, any other issue. To voters, candidates for public office and the platforms of their political parties represent a variety of positions, some of which they are in favor, but wrapped up in others with which they disagree. Sometimes, a vote depends on an assessment of the character of candidates, no matter what their positions actually are - even positions with which they agree. Other times, the resonance with positions in an election is so strong that voters are known to "look the other way" when it comes to the character and integrity of candidates. *And what you'll be reading in this bulletin space has nothing to do with any of that.* All you'll get here is the teaching of the Catholic Church; we understand the plight - even the outright dilemma - voters face when issues are intertwined, and then further intertwined with the candidates who espouse them. Growing Disciples Decisions: Next Steps. We offer our gratitude and appreciation for those who attended our parish town hall meetings in the wake of the final decisions that came from the Growing Disciples Discernment Process. Our commitment was, and is, to answer the questions that we can, and to find the answers that we don't yet have, so as to stay in touch with our parishioners and keep them informed. The diocese has made clear that implementation of Growing Disciples begins on July 1, and that our current ministry and Mass schedule remain the same for the coming year, perhaps a bit longer. Our next step will be the formation of a joint committee from among our five churches which will assist the pastor in the specific decisions and timetable they have to make. Single uniform budget; Mass schedule; what to do with the maintenance, improvement, or discontinued use of our buildings - and what to do with them: all of this begins with the formation of this joint committee. At the same time, we want to discuss and consult with our trustees, our finance councils, and our pastoral council whatever they might want to propose in advance, to insure greater participation in this overall decision-making process. Thanks for your patience - and if you've run out of it, we understand. No recriminations. No response in kind should things have to get heated. Looking forward to your input. Fr. T.
