# Twelfth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**JUNE 23, 2024** 

Job 38:1,8-11; 2 Corinthians 5:14-17; Mark 4:35-41

In olden times, the Church was often described as the "barque" (or bark or boat) of Peter. Even in New Testament times, the Church was often described as a boat which passed through stormy seas in this world.

Everyone in the boat must row hard against the waves; everyone must keep bailing so that the boat will stay afloat through many storms. We shall arrive at the safe harbor of eternal life only if we work together and trust in the Lord.

This is the liturgical background for today's Mass texts. Our first reading is from Job. Job had everything the world could give. As a "test," God permitted him to lose everything.

Job's friends think that he must have sinned grievously, for such evils could not happen to a good person. God tells Job that he must trust in God's wisdom. God made the universe; he is more powerful than any storm. He can bring good out of evil.

The Gospel story of the storm on the sea was told by the primitive Church. The Church wondered how it could survive; it was so small and insignificant; it was constantly battered by the pagans. Where was the Lord when the Church needed him? Was he asleep? Had he abandoned the ship of Church?

The answer to them – and us – is the words of Jesus: "Why are you so lacking in faith?" Jesus calmed the storm on the sea; he will bring us through every other storm. Trust him. The Responsorial Psalm has the same theme.

The second reading does not fit the other two, but it is a good message of faith: We must never judge by external appearances; rather we must see everything in the context of faith.

As you should know by now, Fr. I encourage you to keep us in your prayers as we open up our hearts and lives to be touched by the gift of the Holy Spirit this weekend.

We are needing some parishioners to step forward and to help us in one of our ministries. As some might not know, we pray the rosary at various nursing homes in the area. What a wonderful ministry! We are needing volunteers to lead the rosary at Adams Pointe, the last Wednesday of each month at 3:30 p.m. If you can help these residents to pray, please volunteer your time and efforts for this ministry. It really won't take much but if you had a relative in one of these homes you would appreciate this ministry. Call the rectory and leave your name for our parish nurse and we will be in touch.

The company doing the abatement of the school gym floor is making progress and hopefully will be done in several weeks. We are still hoping and praying that this work will be completed and we can begin to install our new wood floor. What a relief to be rid of this hazardous waste. In my 49 years of being a priest, I have been challenged with asbestos in schools and now mercury in a gym floor. I keep asking myself, what comes next? Our school project is still on schedule as they are doing the preliminary work, preparing the site, developing costs, and finding construction people. I always like to keep you informed because together we are the stewards of this parish. We are still looking for new donors to our "Upon this Rock" campaign. Can you help us?

Migrants and refugees from southwestern and southern Asian countries — such as Syria, Afghanistan, Pakistan, and Bangladesh— travel to Europe by the Balkan route, which runs through southeastern Europe. 




