## Thirteenth Sunday in Ordinary 7ime

**JUNE 30, 2024** 

Wisdom 1:13-15,2:23-24; 2 Corinthians 8:7,9,13-15; Mark 5:21-43 or Mark 5: 21-24, 35b-43

Every human being struggles with the questions of good and evil, of life and death and suffering. Why do bad things sometimes happen to good people? Why do the wicked prosper? Why don't I get my special and necessary miracle?

The longer form of today's Gospel tells of two miracles: the raising from the dead of a little girl, and the healing of a woman who had been afflicted with a hemorrhage for many years. Suppose the woman was not cured. Suppose the little girl was not raised from the dead. Would we then blame God for not intervening?

The first reading tells us that God did not - and does not - make evil or death. The first principle of every Christian is to realize that God is good and merciful. We must look for other explanations of the problems of suffering and death; God doesn't ever cause them.

From today's readings, then, we should examine our philosophy or outlook about our lives. Who do we think we are? How does this world function? How do we ourselves fit in?

Some people think that all their thoughts and actions are at the mercy of angelic or diabolical forces; they are simply pawns on a cosmic chessboard who are at the mercy of others. And some others think that their conscious actions are merely an overflow of unconscious and buried manias and phobias and drives.

Other people think that they are little more than complex machines: Their thoughts and actions are a result of genes and environmental factors beyond their control; therefore they are not responsible. Other people cannot believe in God because they see so much evil in the world; they cannot imagine that an all-good God would permit bad things to happen to good people.

Christians believe in the "natural order." There are laws of physics and biology. But the human being even in this "natural order" has intelligence and free will. We can alter our environment; we can change our behavior consciously; we can cope maturely even when things go wrong. But over and above the "natural order," we believe that God is good and that he is with us.

He does not often intervene in the "natural order," he doesn't stop a truck; he doesn't interfere with gravity or with other forces. But somehow he gives us spiritual power (call it "grace") to put things together in our lives.

He can bring good out of evil. He makes all things - even suffering and death - work together for good for those who love him. The clincher is that he offers us everlasting joy. He asks us to be faithful to him, even if we don't get the miracle we want.



#### FAMILY SCHOOL AGREEMENT

What are those green cards that families are putting in the collection basket?

July 6/7 marks the first weekend for families to submit their green Family School Agreement Mass cards.

In April of this year we held three meetings to share the updated guidelines for the Family School Agreement.

The agreement calls for our parents to be present at Sunday Mass (or Saturday evening) at least 51% of the time in the parishes of our deanery (St. Peter, St. Francis, St. Anthony & Blessed Sacrament). At the close of the 2023-2024 school year color coded cards were sent home with school families. They will sign and place the cards in the collection baskets at any of the parishes. The same is true at Liberty, St. Joseph, Quincy University Chapel, or Mendon. The cards will be collected and brought to St. Peter Parish. The cards are color coded and if forgotten, each of the four parishes who have schools will have the appropriate color coded cards as extras available in the narthex or entrance of the Church.

Families who have fulfilled the family school agreement during the course of the coming year will receive the parish subsidy towards the 2025-2026 tuition. Families who have not fulfilled the family school agreement will be assessed the rate of a non-participating family.






