Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

JUNE 9, 2024

Genesis 3:9-15; 2 Corinthians 4:13-5:1; Mark 3:20-35

When the New Testament speaks of the family of Jesus, it probably means the "extended family," or the clan – with cousins and aunts and uncles. Jesus grew up among his relatives; they heard of all that he did elsewhere, and they could not understand it. They just knew him as the next door kid. They could put no faith in him.

Today's Gospel begins with his family thinking that he is crazy. Then the Scribes state that he casts out devils by Beelzebul, the prince of devils. Jesus answers by saying that a house divided against itself cannot stand. Jesus says that all sins are forgivable except the sin against the Holy Spirit. In the context of today's Gospel the sin against the Holy Spirit is the sin of attributing evil to one who is doing good.

The first reading is the tragic scene immediately after Adam and Eve had sinned. They rationalize: Adam blames Eve; Eve blames the serpent. The end of the reading is often called the "Protoevangelium" or the "first bit of good news."

God promises that the son of the woman will attack and conquer evil. Jesus does this. He not only expels devils which cause physical ailments; he expels the devils from our souls by his forgiveness and his mercy.

The second reading urges us to place our trust completely in God. We must never lose heart, for he is with us to forgive, to renew, to strengthen. We should always see everything in the light of our goal of eternal salvation.

Tenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, June 9, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

With the conclusion of the Solemnity of Pentecost, the Church had returned to what is called "ordinary time." However, as I pointed out, this "ordinary time" was interrupted on the weekends with two differing solemnities, the Solemnity of the Trinity, and the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. Now this weekend, the Church returns to "ordinary time" as it celebrates the 10th Sunday in this liturgical time.

In some of the statues that I have seen of the Blessed Mother, especially those who try to portray the Immaculate Conception (Mary conceived without original sin), we find Mary standing with arms open and her feet standing on the head of a snake. I bring this to your attention as the image of this stature is reflected in our first reading of our Mass today from the Book of Genesis. In this reading we hear how sin entered into the world by eating of the fruit of the tree forbidden to them by God. Now they find themselves naked in the garden and confronted by God for their choice. After blaming each other and then finally blaming the serpent for the temptation, God addresses the serpent and bans it from all the animals. But then God gives a sense of hope to this fallen world. This is from where that statue of Mary is portrayed. God says to the serpent, "I will put enmity between you and the woman, and between your offspring and hers; he will strike at your head, while you strike at his heel." The promise of Mary, conceived without sin, will be fulfilled and pictured in this statue. She stands on the head of the serpent, the new Eve, free from sin, and yet the serpent strikes at her heel with all its temptations to no avail. For it will be her offspring that will usher in the new creation. Sin and death will be overcome for Jesus is that new Adam who takes away our sins forever.

Just want to make sure that you are well aware that Fr. Jayke White will be with us next weekend, June 15-16, and will be preaching at all of our Masses. We will have a reception for him in our cafeteria at all of our Masses on that Sunday. Please make sure that you come and congratulate him that weekend. We are very proud to have been a part of his formation last summer as a deacon.

Also, next Saturday, June 15, the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women will be recognizing various "women of distinction" throughout the diocese for their work and ministry in the local Church. This year it was my privilege to submit "Sharon Mays" for this honor. Believe me, there are so many others from our parish that I could have submitted as our parish is filled with many women of distinction. But this year, I congratulate Sharon Mays on her reception of this award. There is a Mass and dinner in Springfield honoring these women next Saturday.

I also received word this past week that work on the abatement in our gym will be taking place next week. This is a month in advance so everything seems to be working out well. Say a prayer that this work will be done without any hitch and that the new floor will be installed before school begins. I have to keep telling myself to trust in the Lord—what I say to you so often I have to make it a part of my life. This old floor, as I was told, was the from the pastorate of Fr. Doug LeBreton, a pastor from 1974-1985.
