Jeremiah 23:1-6; Ephesians 2:13-18; Mark 6:30-34

The word "pastor" means "shepherd." Very early in the history of the Middle East, "shepherd" was used as a metaphor for kings and priests and other leaders of the people. In their early history, the Israelites had been nomad shepherds. They kept sheep and goats for milk, cheese, and wool.

Usually they did not keep the sheep to eat. Sheep were almost like pets; they were often given names. Like our pets, the sheep would come when called by name – but they would only come to their own shepherd, not to a stranger.

Some people think that sheep are very smart, but others think sheep are pretty dumb - they must rely on the shepherd for food, water, safety, and for all other things. One who keeps sheep told me that they are the smartest of all animals - in trying to escape the enclosu e! But he thinks they are pretty dumb in all other ways.

Sheep need the shepherd to protect them from predators. Sheep need the shepherd in order not to get hopelessly lost. The shepherd, in sort, provided for all needs of the sheep.

The Lord was the shepherd of Israel. He provided for all Israel's needs. When Israel asked for a king, the king was supposed to shepherd the flock of the Lord. All too often, however, the king led the people away from God and he plundered them.

In our first reading, Jeremiah condemns these bad shepherds, the rotten kings who led God's sheep astray. In the Responsorial Psalm, we proclaim that the Lord is our Shepherd. In the Gospel, the disciples return after being sent on mission by the Lord. He tells them to rest a while. Meanwhile, people keep pressing in on him. He pities them, for they are like shepherd-less sheep.

Pray for your shepherds: the pope, the bishop, and your pastors. Pray that many young men will respond to Christ's call to be priests. Pray that people will respect and follow those who shepherd in the Lord's name.

From Father Burusu:

For this year 2024 the Diocese of Nyundo in Rwanda set a goal to renovate its Minor Seminary (Saint Pius X Seminary) which was devastated by the Sebeya flood.

SEBEYA RIVER DISASTER

The *Sebeya* is a river in Western Province, Rwanda that flows into the Lake Kivu just south of the town of Gisenyi. This river runs alongside Our Minor Seminary. Between the seminary and the Sebeya there is a distance of 50 meters.

In the month of May there was a lot of rain in Rwanda, and because this is a mountainous and volcanic region, this year, bad weather moved in the entire central eastern region of Rwanda. On the night of May 2 to 3, 2023, our school was hit by the flood disaster caused by the Sebeya river. Flood devastated our infrastructures; Food store was completely destroyed, drinking water pipes busted, and refectory, chapel and classes were filled by water and mud.

The Diocese of Nyundo is trying to rebuild herself after the genocide of 1994 against the Tutsi, where we lost more than 25 priests. We find ourselves having challenges to continue with seminarian formation because of the Sebeya flood we encountered last year. However, with your continuing hospitality and kindness we will be able to move forward with seminarian formation. These are the future priests of our local church and the Universal church.

However, in spite of the above challenge, The Church is One. We are one community of believers. And this is what we profess in our creed. The Missionary Cooperation Plan is an opportunity to support missionaries, religious and lay catechists among the suffering, and poor of the missions in the world.

Our mission is the same. Through baptism we are all united in the one body of Christ. We are all Disciples of Christ. We are all called to the mission of Christ. Because of our baptism we are one community. Therefore, the Missionary Cooperation Plan is a call for solidarity. Please pray fully to consider your donation to the mission in Rwanda this weekend.

Sunday, August 25 from 7:30 a.m.-Noon On College Street in front of school.






