Jeremiah 23:1-6; Ephesians 2:13-18;
Mark 6:30-34

The word “pastor” means “shepherd.” Very early in the history of the Middle East, “shepherd” was used as a metaphor for kings and priests and other leaders of the people. In their early history, the Israelites had been nomad shepherds. They kept sheep and goats for milk, cheese, and wool.

Usually they did not keep the sheep to eat. Sheep were almost like pets; they were often given names. Like our pets, the sheep would come when called by name – but they would only come to their own shepherd, not to a stranger.

Some people think that sheep are very smart, but others think sheep are pretty dumb – they must rely on the shepherd for food, water, safety, and for all other things. One who keeps sheep told me that they are the smartest of all animals – in trying to escape the enclosure! But he thinks they are pretty dumb in all other ways.

Sheep need the shepherd to protect them from predators. Sheep need the shepherd in order not to get hopelessly lost. The shepherd, in sort, provided for all needs of the sheep.

The Lord was the shepherd of Israel. He provided for all Israel’s needs. When Israel asked for a king, the king was supposed to shepherd the flock of the Lord. All too often, however, the king led the people away from God and he plundered them.

In our first reading, Jeremiah condemns these bad shepherds, the rotten kings who led God’s sheep astray. In the Responsorial Psalm, we proclaim that the Lord is our Shepherd. In the Gospel, the disciples return after being sent on mission by the Lord. He tells them to rest a while. Meanwhile, people keep pressing in on him. He pities them, for they are like shepherd-less sheep.

Pray for your shepherds: the pope, the bishop, and your pastors. Pray that many young men will respond to Christ’s call to be priests. Pray that people will respect and follow those who shepherd in the Lord’s name.

Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, July 21, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

Last week our gospel spoke of the occasion of Jesus sending His apostles out, two by two, to preach, to drive out demons, and to heal the sick. Now they have returned from their mission, a bit exhausted, and very tired from their labors. Jesus recognized their exhaustion so He took them off in a boat to a deserted place where they could eat and rest. The unfortunate part is the people, who longed for what they had, found them again and would not allow them this time away. Our gospel tells us that “when Jesus disembarked and saw the vast crowd, His heart was moved with pity for them, for they were like sheep without a shepherd, and He began to teach them many things.” I wonder if Jesus has the same vision as He looks to His world today. There are many sheep, following all differing voices, seeking a happiness in the things of this world, and looking for love, as the song goes, in all the differing places. I know that as Jesus looks at His world that He has saved and reconciled, that He shakes His head in sorrow. For He who is the Way, the Truth, and the Life, is being supplanted by human desires and human yearnings. Into this environment, the Church still needs more shepherds to serve the abundance of sheep that the Lord is calling. Please pray for vocations to the priesthood and religious life; and pray that our parents, and families, are living out their particular vocations leading their young sheep closer to the Lord by word and example.

For the past two weeks, I have seen many more young families present at our Eucharist on the weekends. This is great and I am so happy that many of our student families accepted the challenges of our family school agreement and are making the Eucharist a priority. So proud of all of you. Sometimes all it takes is a little nudge or special invite and people will respond. For those who have, I thank you as it is a joy to see our Church so full.

Just to let you know that I will be taking off this Thursday, July 25 for my own getaway. I am meeting my brother and sister-in-law in Frankenmuth, Michigan. Besides being the home of the largest Christmas store in the world, it is such a relaxing place to visit. One loses track of time in this German community. Isn't that what vacations are for? It is my intent to limit my purchasing powers at the Christmas store. The reason for this limit is that some time soon the bishop will accept my resignation as pastor and what I have been saving will have to eventually be packed and moved with me. Then after six days in Frankenmuth, I plan on going to my brother's in Lancaster, Pennsylvania to visit for another four or five days. Fr. Paul will be tossed into the fray as the shepherd of this parish while I am away for a respite.

We recently met with Klingner and Associates regarding the plans for our capital improvement project. They needed some clarification on some aspects of our construction so that they could continue the designs. I always find these meetings interesting as you hear first hand the various restrictions, requirements, and legal necessities in construction, let alone additions to a school. It was quite enlightening and of course as the pastor, all I could see was dollar signs. But such is the state of construction. It will be the first of many more meetings.

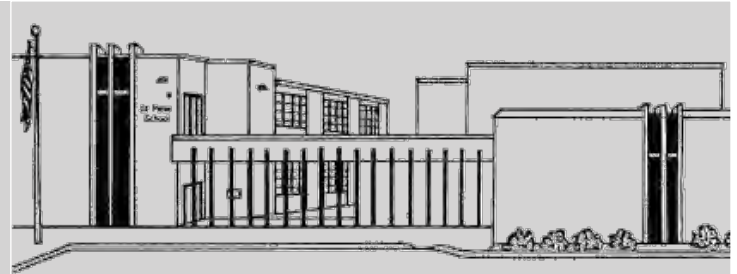

FAMILY SCHOOL AGREEMENT

What are those green cards that families are putting
in the collection basket?

July 6/7 marked the first weekend for families to submit their green Family School Agreement Mass cards.

In April of this year we held three meetings to share the updated guidelines for the Family School Agreement.

The agreement calls for our parents to be present at Sunday Mass (or Saturday evening) at least 51% of the time in the parishes of our deanery (St. Peter, St. Francis, St. Anthony & Blessed Sacrament). At the close of the 2023-2024 school year color coded cards were sent home with school families. They will sign and place the cards in the collection baskets at any of the parishes. The same is true at Liberty, St. Joseph, Quincy University Chapel, or Mendon. The cards will be collected and brought to St. Peter Parish. The cards are color coded and if forgotten, each of the four parishes who have schools will have the appropriate color coded cards as extras available in the narthex or entrance of the Church.

Families who have fulfilled the family school agreement during the course of the coming year, will receive the parish subsidy towards the 2025-2026 tuition. Families who have not fulfilled the family school agreement, will be assessed the rate of a non-participating family.




