2 Kings 4:42-44; Ephesians 4:1-6;
John 6:1-15

This liturgical year (“B” in our lectionary) is called “the Year of Mark.” Most of our Sunday Gospels are taken from the Gospel according to Mark. (Next year, they will be taken from Luke; the following year they will be taken from Matthew.) But today, and for the next four Sundays, we interrupt the sequence of Mark.

Our Gospels for these Sundays are taken from the Sixth Chapter of John. Today’s Gospel is the “sign” of the loaves and fishes. For the next four Sundays, we shall have portions of Jesus’ sermon on the “Bread of Life.”

The first reading is usually selected to fit the theme of the Gospel. Today, therefore, our reading is an Old Testament miracle of multiplication of loaves. Elisha the prophet feeds a hundred men from a few barley loaves.

Our second reading rarely fits the theme of the other two Scripture readings. It is called the “continuous reading,” since we begin one New Testament book and continue through it until the end, regardless of the theme of the Gospel. Even though today’s second reading doesn’t “fit,” it is especially beautiful: There must be unity in the Church, since there is one Lord, one faith, one baptism, and one God and Father of us all. All of us must work for unity by seeking reconciliation instead of rage, love instead of lambasting.

No one knows exactly what happened in the “sign” of the loaves and fishes. John does not say that Jesus created new loaves or multiplied the substance of the old ones. We usually assume this, however. Obviously what he did was a “sign.”

Perhaps the sign was a miracle of creation. Or perhaps it was a miracle of getting people to share. Considering the selfishness of most of us, getting people to share might be just as great a miracle for the Lord as the creation of new substance! The “sign” was intended to fulfill the Jewish expectation for a new miracle of manna when the Messiah came.

Some of the world hungers for bread for the body; Christians must seek to feed them. All of the world hungers for the bread of the spirit; we shall have gnawing in our lives until we are satisfied with the bread of Christ’s truth; Christians must feed the world by giving the bread of truth to others. And all of us need the nourishment of the Eucharist, the new manna of salvation, the Bread which will spring up to eternal life.

Dear Parishioners,

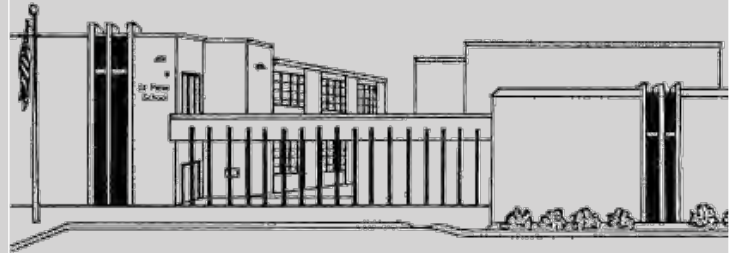
As I sit here looking at my calendar, I keep thinking to myself where did this summer go? It's hard to believe that in less than three weeks we will be starting up school again. Yes, I realize that with the transition of priests, the work on our gym floor, and the day to day running of things, the busyness of the summer months made the summer vacation, shall we say, "short-lived." It has rapidly progressed and I am sorry to say, way tooooooo fast. The first day of school is Wednesday, August 14 with a half day.

As a pastor, one of my goals was to help St. Peter Church embrace "stewardship" in our parish families. The reason for this goal is that I consider stewardship fundamental to our roles as disciples of Christ. Through stewardship, we become a thankful people, a people who recognize God's blessings in our lives and who in response, give generously back to Him. Through stewardship, we grow in gratitude for what we have been given, and in return, share our gifts of time, talents, and treasures with the source of all our gifts, God Himself. There is no better illustration of stewardship than our gospel for our Mass this weekend. In this gospel, there is a large crowd following Jesus, and Jesus was aware that they were hungering for both spiritual food as well as physical food. Jesus asks the disciples, "where can we buy enough food for them to eat?" After a negative response by one of His disciples, another disciple stated that there is a boy present who "has five barley loaves and two fish, but what good are these for so many?" Thus the stage is set for stewardship. Jesus takes the bread and loaves, gave thanks for them, and then distributed them to the people, as much as they wanted. The message of stewardship is so clear. We give God thanks for our gifts, whatever they might be, whether discovered or yet not unveiled to us, and then Jesus multiplies them and uses them according to His will. As I said, this gospel is what I have been trying to instill in our parish family. It is an attitude of trust, it is an attitude of thankfulness, and it is an attitude of God being the source and fount of many blessings and gifts. Through stewardship, God takes what He has given to us, multiplies it over and over, and uses it for His Will, not mine. May each of us grow in the attitude of stewardship and God will always provide. I believe and try to live that.

When you read this bulletin column, I plan on being in Frankenmuth, Michigan, for a little R & R. After about six days in this area of Michigan, I plan on going to my brother's home around Lancaster, Pennsylvania. Should be home around August 6. Please pray for me as I will be praying for you. You are always in my thoughts and prayers.

We are still looking for parishioners who have not contributed yet to our "Upon this Rock" campaign. As you can see from our goal, we are a little shy of reaching it and need more parishioners to respond. With the goal for which we are shooting, we hope to have not only a cafeteria but also much needed classroom space. Our plans are taking shape as the architects, structural engineers, as well as many other experts try to accommodate our expectations. And of course, we have to always abide by the laws provided by local and state officials.






