

Pastor's Letter

July 28, 2024—17th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family

When we look at the problems facing the world, we might be tempted to think that there is nothing we can do about them. Global challenges like pandemics, famine, poverty, war, climate change, and the erosion of spiritual, moral, and social values all seem to be beyond the ability of any one of us to overcome. There is so much need out there. What could we possibly have to offer to meet it?

In our Gospel reading for today St. Andrew asks that very question. Confronted with the challenge of trying to feed five thousand people he says, "There is a boy here who has five barley loaves and two fish; but what good are these for so many?" But when this small offering is placed in the hands of Jesus, it becomes more than enough to meet the need. Because the disciples (including the boy who gave up his lunch) are willing to give the little that they have, our Lord adds to it from the abundance of his power and love and all those people experience the miraculous providence of God. This great miracle reminds us that if we make ourselves available to God, however limited our gifts or imperfect our love may be, God can use us to accomplish great things that glorify him and help our fellow human beings.

But the feeding of the five thousand points to something even more profound and powerful. When we read how Jesus took the loaves, gave thanks, and distributed them we can't help but be reminded of our Lord's gift of himself in the holy Eucharist. And when we receive that gift in holy communion, God doesn't just do great things for us, he does great things in us. If we are open to it, we are healed, renewed and strengthened in our pursuit of holiness. Just as there was more than enough food after Jesus blessed it, we receive more than enough grace to meet our own needs and the extra that we receive can be poured into the lives of others. And sharing God's love with others is another gift in itself.

Mission Weekend Recap

Last weekend Fr. Charles Ntabyera was here to speak on Mission Sunday. Below is a summary of what was talked about and their mission.

For this year 2024 the Diocese of Nyundo in Rwanda set a goal to renovate its Minor Seminary (Saint Pius X Seminary) which was devastated by the Sebeya flood.

SEBEYA RIVER DISASTER

The Sebeya is a river in Western Province, Rwanda that flows into the Lake Kivu just south of the town of Gisenyi. This river runs alongside Our Minor Seminary. Between the seminary and the Sebeya there is a distance of 50 meters.

In the month of May there was a lot of rain in Rwanda, and because this is a mountainous and volcanic region, this year, bad weather moved in the entire central eastern region of Rwanda. On the night of May 2 to 3, 2023, our school was hit by the flood disaster caused by the Sebeya river. Flood devastated our infrastructures; Food store was completely destroyed, drinking water pipes busted, and refectory, chapel, and classes were filled by water and mud.

The Diocese of Nyundo is trying to rebuild herself after the genocide of 1994 against the Tutsi, where we lost more than 25 priests. We find ourselves having challenges to continue with seminarian formation because of the Sebeya flood we encountered last year. However, with your continuing hospitality and kindness we will be able to move forward with seminarian formation. These are the future priests of our local church and the Universal church.

However, in spite of the above challenge, The Church is One. We are one community of believers. And this is what we profess in our creed. The Missionary Cooperation Plan is an opportunity to support missionaries, religious and lay catechists among the suffering, and poor of the missions in the world.

Our mission is the same. Through baptism we are all united in the one body of Christ. We are all Disciples of Christ. We are all called to the mission of Christ. Because of our baptism we are one community. Therefore, the Missionary Cooperation Plan is a call for solidarity. Please pray fully to consider your donation to the mission in Rwanda this weekend.

QCES Mass Attendance Cards

Starting July 6 and 7, Catholic school families throughout Quincy will start reporting their Mass attendance to their parishes. School families who are parishioners or visiting our church will sign a <u>WHITE</u> card with the names of their students, and school they attend and drop the card in the collection basket during Mass. The cards will be recorded on a document in FACTS. Cards are available at all the Quincy area churches and the QU chapel. Starting with the 2024-25 school year, students in each of the Quincy Catholic Elementary schools are required to attend Mass *51 percent* of the time to receive the parishioner tuition rate.
