## Fourteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

**JULY 7, 2024** 

Ezekiel 2:2-5; 2 Corinthians 12:7-10; Mark 6:1-6a

The prophets of old were not predictors of the future; they were spokesmen for God: They told the truth. They called people to repentance. They told people where they were sinning. No one likes to hear a hurtful truth, so the prophets were feared – and hated – by the people.

Jesus and his apostles follow in the line of the prophets. Jesus proclaimed the truth, but not even his own family would accept it. They couldn't understand how someone they grew up with could have any special knowledge of God. So they closed their minds.

St. Paul suffered mightily because he proclaimed the truth: He was betrayed by friends, and shunned by fellow Christians; he was beaten, shipwrecked, jailed, and rejected.

Today's second reading gives us another aspect of his suffering: He had a "thorn in the flesh" (probably some awful looking disease), and he begged God to take it away. The Lord's answer was: "My grace is sufficient for you!"

Ezekiel was a prophet, even though people wouldn't listen to him. How do we react to a hurtful message of truth? Jesus was Son of God and Messiah, even when people thought he was just a neighborhood good ole boy. We are called to be spokespersons for God, to proclaim his truth whether this world accepts it or not.

How do we react when we are not believed? How do we react when we are ridiculed for the truth? Let us pray for the courage to be open to the truth. And let us pray for the courage to profess the truth even when we suffer for it. Someone should stand up for what is true and right and good! If we do not do so, who will?

This award will be given on Thursday, July 11 at 10:00 a.m. I want to thank the many people who have taken much pride in our campus and who have made this award possible through their time and efforts in making our campus a source of pride for us. To all of our workers, this award is for you and reflects your ministry to the parish family by making our grounds a thing of beauty.

News release from our Diocese: "Area Catholics and others devoted to the venerable Servant of God Fr. Augustine Tolton—who grew up in Quincy, ministered in Quincy, and is buried in Quincy—will commemorate the 127th anniversary of his death with a Eucharistic Pilgrimage procession and prayers for his beatification and canonization on Tuesday, July 9, in Quincy. Fr. Tolton is recognized as the first black priest in the United States and the Cause for his beatification and canonization of sainthood is underway in Rome. The Junipero Serra branch of the National Eucharistic Procession will join the annual procession to Fr. Tolton's grave as it makes its way to Indianapolis. The schedule for the evening is as follows:

\*5:30 p.m. Procession forms at St. Peter's Catholic Church and begins walking to Fr. Tolton's grave after prayer. The processional route will follow the south side of Maine Street until it crosses onto the east side of South 33rd Street until it reaches St. Peter Catholic Cemetery where Fr. Tolton is buried.

\*6:30 p.m. Evening prayer and benediction of the Blessed Sacrament at Fr. Tolton's grave.

\*7:30 Potluck dinner and witness talk at St. Francis Parish Center.

\*8:30-9:30 p.m. Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament in St. Francis Church.




