Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

AUGUST 11, 2024

1 Kings 19:4-8; Ephesians 4:30-5:2;
John 6:41-51

Our Gospel selection continues to be taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to John. Read it carefully! At the time of Jesus, the rabbis had a list of more than 400 “signs” which would point to the Messiah. One of these was manna. They thought that the Messiah would give them manna again, and that this manna would not only be for body but also for soul. Manna became a synonym for the wisdom of the Torah.

Recall that John’s Gospel shows how Jesus replaces all the forms, feasts, and institutions of Judaism. The first part of John’s Gospel is called “the Book of Signs.” John gives seven “signs” by which Jesus replaces the old, and shows that he is Messiah. He replaces the expected sign of manna with the multiplication of loaves and fishes. But he also replaces the “manna” of the Torah with himself, his way of life.

He, not the Torah, is the ultimate revelation of God which has come down from heaven. He, not the Torah, will give eternal life. The Pharisees expected the resurrection of the dead when the Messiah came, but they did not expect that the Messiah would do this.

Jesus says that he himself will bring about the resurrection of the dead – if only they believe in him. If a person commits his entire life to Jesus Christ, he will not suffer eternal death. Next Sunday, Jesus will carry the “sign” of the replacement of manna even further: He will give a new sign or sacrament which is his Body and Blood, the Eucharist.

The first reading tells of the discouragement of Elijah. He had performed a great sign and destroyed the prophets and priests of the pagan god Baal, but the people did not believe. Elijah just wants to die. God provides him with food and tells him to get up and go to the mountain of God (Horeb or Sinai). There, where Moses received the Torah, he will be renewed in spirit. Our first reading is good advice: Don’t sadden the Holy Spirit by harsh words, bitterness, or anger. We must be kind and forgiving if we are children of God.

Nineteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 11, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

On this second Sunday of August, we gather as the Church to celebrate the 19th Sunday in Ordinary Time. For the past three weeks, the Church has been using Chapter 6 of the Gospel of John as the gospel, drawing our attention to Jesus as the “Bread of Life.” If there is one gospel that summarizes us as Catholics, it is this gospel that we have been using and will continue to use in the next few weeks for it defines us as a “People whose lives are centered upon the Eucharist.” Jesus tells us today that “He is the bread that came down from heaven.” But the people are confused and become critical of Jesus because of what He was saying. Since they knew his father and mother, they knew that He was not what or who He was saying He was. But Jesus continued His declaration as He states what we believe today: “I am the bread of life. Your ancestors ate the manna in the desert, but they died; this is the bread that comes down from heaven so that one may eat it and not die. I am the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that I will give is my flesh for the life of the world.” Do we really believe the words of Jesus and His declaration of Himself as the bread of life? For many of us, Jesus’ words give comfort and consolation especially as we face the reality of death in our lives. If we remain close to our Lord in the Eucharist, then whatever comes our way we are able to face for we truly have hope in Jesus as that bread of life that will give us that eternal life. And it is always a strength for me to celebrate a funeral Mass for a person whose life was centered upon the Eucharist for those words always ring true for me and the person who died. What a strength!

This Sunday, August 11, we are beginning our new school year with a Mass for our school families at 11:00 a.m. I encourage our school families to be present with us as we ask God’s blessings upon our new school year. After this Mass, our students and their families are invited over to the grade school to meet their teachers and to drop off their school supplies. Our first day of school will be Wednesday, August 14 with a half day of school. Then we begin a new school year with a full day on Thursday, August 15.

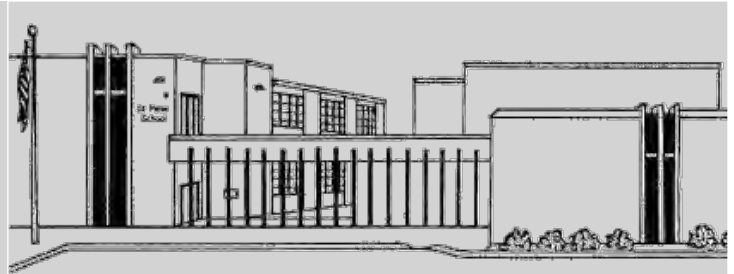


