Proverbs 9:1-6; Ephesians 5:15-20;
John 6:51-58

Our Gospel selection continues to be taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to John. The new “sign” of manna (expected by the Jews when the Messiah came) is fulfilled in Jesus: He feeds 5,000 people. He replaces the manna of the Torah with belief in himself. And today he does something even more startling: He gives himself under the sign of bread to be the manna of our souls. He gives us the Eucharist which is truly his Body and his Blood.

Six times in this passage, Jesus makes it clear that we must truly eat his flesh and drink his blood to have life. There is no doubt whatsoever that he means this sacrament to be the reality of himself, and not merely a “symbol” or “ordination.” “Flesh and blood” is a Semitic way of saying “the whole person.”

Catholics take Jesus and the Scriptures as they are. As difficult as it is to believe that the Lord Jesus Christ is truly present in the Eucharist, we accept it because Jesus Christ said it, and because the Scriptures teach it, and because the Church has always held it.

Many who cannot accept the teaching try all kinds of devices to show that it isn't so: They will say that this passage is not part of the original words of Jesus, but is an addition by John. (Even if this were true, we hold that the Gospel is inspired, and therefore John teaches truth.)

They also try to say that it is inconceivable that Jesus would have said this in the context of a synagogue discourse. (Even so, it is inspired Scripture.) Every single Eucharistic reference in the New Testament reflects the belief that it is truly the Body and Blood of the Lord.

Jesus Christ is our Bread of life: We must believe in him and commit our lives to him. In order to do that, we desperately need his strength which comes to us in the Eucharist, the Bread of life, which is truly his Body and his Blood, his entire Saving Person.

Twentieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 18, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

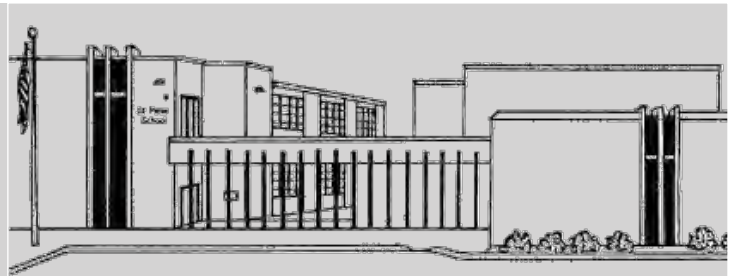
Our responsorial psalm seems to summarize both our gospel and our first reading for our Mass this weekend. This responsorial psalm declares, “Taste and see the goodness of the Lord.” Our first reading is from the Book of Proverbs and it presents the Wisdom of God, a wisdom that invites us to her banquet. In this banquet this wisdom of God states: “Come, eat of my food, and drink of the wine I have mixed.” Does this sound familiar to us? It should since that is what we do each and every time that we gather to celebrate the Eucharist. We are invited to come, eat of my food and drink of the wine I have mixed. So often we fail to understand this call to each of us. But the Lord and His wisdom invites us to a meal where the food and drink we share each Sunday is truly the Body and Blood of Jesus. The difficulty is that we need to recognize our own lack of understanding with this meal, not realizing how much we are hungering and thirsting for this Wisdom that God gives to us in this meal. So often our hungering and thirsting seem to reside in the things of this world, the very things that are not lasting but only fleeing. The Eucharist is the one meal that the Church celebrates which opens up our hearts, and lives, to the very wisdom of God, seeking what is permanent and lasting which is what the Bread of Life and the Cup of Salvation is all about.

Our gospel for today continues this theme. Inviting us to “taste and see the goodness of the Lord.” Jesus speaks to us that which Catholics have believed from the very beginning of the Church, namely, that “Jesus is the living bread that came down from heaven; whoever eats this bread will live forever; and the bread that Jesus gives is His flesh for the life of the world.” The difficulty is that many of His disciples thought this was a very hard saying, so much so that many left Him. But Jesus did not soften his language but rather continued to say strongly, “Whoever eats my flesh and drinks my blood has eternal life and I will raise that person up on the last day.” In this statement, we have the wisdom of God presented to us. It is the understanding of the Church that the Eucharist is the Real Presence of Jesus, that when we come forward for Holy Communion, we are receiving the very Body and Blood of Christ. It is not a symbol, but rather the Real Presence of Jesus. This is a hard saying as it was in Jesus’ time but it reflects the wisdom of God, not the wisdom of humankind.

On behalf of our parish family, I want to welcome our visiting Religious Sister from the Benedictine Sisters of Our Lady of Help of Christians. She is here this weekend through the 2024 Missionary Coop Appeal from our diocese. I ask you to open your hearts and your ears to her message and then respond generously to her message.

Next Saturday, August 24, we will be celebrating our St. Peter Annual Parish Picnic beginning right after the 4:00 p.m. Mass. This picnic will go until Midnight and will involve many games, raffles, silent auctions, much food and drink and music. I invite you to come and join us, bringing your smiles, and welcoming spirit as we try to make this evening a lot of fun and enjoyment. Please help to support our efforts, especially in your prayers and volunteering your time.




