Primera lectura

`Jos 24, 1-2a. 15-17. 18b

En aquellos días, Josué convocó en Siquem a todas las tribus de Israel y reunió a los ancianos, a los jueces, a los jefes y a los escribas. El que ama a su esposa se ama a sí mismo, pues nadie jamás ha odiado a su propio cuerpo, sino que le da alimento y calor, como Cristo hace con la Iglesia, porque somos miembros de su cuerpo. Por eso abandonará el hombre a su padre y a su madre, se unirá a su mujer y serán los dos una sola cosa. Éste es un gran misterio, y yo lo refiero a Cristo y a la Iglesia.

Simon Peter answered him, "Master, to whom shall we go? You have the words of eternal life. We have come to believe and are convinced that you are the Holy One of God."


