Joshua 24:1-2a,15-17,18b;
Ephesians 5:21-32 or Ephesians 5:2a, 25-32;
John 6:60-69

A “covenant” is a binding contract between unequal parties which is sealed in blood. In the Bible, we find several “examples of “assemblies” or “gatherings” to ratify a covenant. The first is in Exodus 24, at Mt. Sinai, where the children of Israel swear that they will keep all the commands of the Lord. Another is in 2 Chronicles 34, where Israel (punished and now returned from Babylonian Exile) renews its covenant with God.

Today’s first reading is another assembly: It is forty years after Moses led Israel out of Egypt. Moses is dead. Joshua has led Israel into the Promised Land and conquered it. Now all the tribes gather to renew the covenant. Joshua asks them to make a decision: “Do you want to serve the Lord or not?” The people swear that they will be loyal.

In the Gospel, Jesus asks his disciples to make a decision. He has some things which are tough to accept. Some of his disciples have abandoned him for speaking nonsense. He asks the others if they, too, will leave. They answer what we should always answer: “Lord, to whom shall we go? Only you have the words of everlasting life.”

In context, the “tough” statements of Jesus concern the “Real Presence” of Christ in the Eucharist. But there are many other “tough” teachings. One is found in the second reading: Husbands and wives are one; there can be no such thing as divorce. Their married love is to be a sign of the lasting love of Christ and his Church.

Some other “tough” teachings concern sexuality: To seek sexual pleasure outside of marriage is always a mortal sin. That’s tough, because the world teaches just the opposite.

Another tough teaching concerns family planning: Catholics must plan their families by using natural means only. It is tough to have charity and forgiveness to others. To follow Christ means to be loyal to him even in the tough decisions of life. A “smorgasbord” Catholic who picks and chooses only the pleasant beliefs is really no Catholic at all.

Let us pray for humility to follow Christ completely and wholeheartedly. To whom else would we go? Only he has the words of everlasting life.

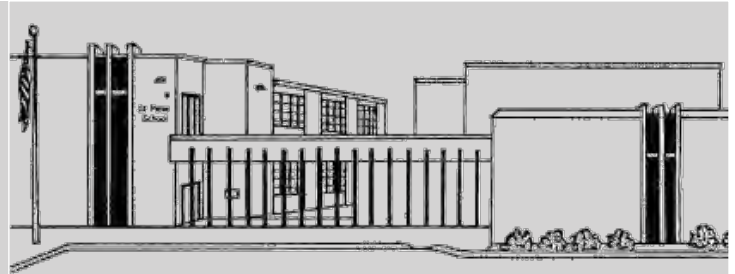


