

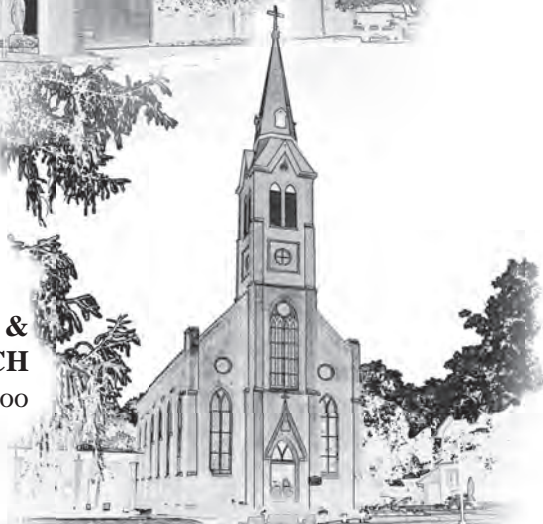

As Convention and Election Days Draw Near.

"The common good is always oriented towards the progress of persons: 'The order of things must be subordinate to the order of persons, and not the other way around.' This order is founded upon truth, built up in justice, and animated by love." (Paragraph 1912). " 'Participation' is the voluntary and generous engagement of a person in social interchange. It is necessary that all participate, each according to his position and role, in promoting the common good. This obligation is inherent in the dignity of the human person." (Paragraph 1913). "Participation is achieved first of all by taking charge of the areas for which one assumes *personal* responsibility: by the care taken for the education of his family, by conscientious work, and so forth, man participates in the good of others in society." (Paragraph 1914). " 'One must pay tribute to those nations whose systems permit the largest possible number of the citizens to take part in public life in a climate of genuine freedom.'" (Paragraph 1915). " 'One is entitled to think that the future of humanity is in the hands of those who are capable of providing the generations to come with reasons for life and optimism.'" August 15: 8:30 a.m., SPPN (SPPS students present at this Mass, as well as on August 17).

7:00 p.m., SMH

Our regrets and apologies in advance, in the face of this, and future adjustments to the Mass schedules to which you are accustomed. Scheduling will be awkward and inconsistent as we head toward the summer of next year.

Major Weekday Mass Schedule Change: Coming in September. Growing Disciples Preparation and Implementation is going to involve all of our churches' committees, plus a separate Growing Disciples Committee. I really want to make sure that each of our churches - including those designated no longer in use - are given opportunities for reaction and input throughout this coming year. This is going to mean that evenings need to be "freed up" for meetings within an earlier time frame, especially for younger members with children; and I'll have to be at all of them. In preparation for this realignment of time in our overall parish schedule, **the following weekday Mass schedule will be in effect, Monday, Labor Day, September 2:**

Monday: SPPN, 8:00 a.m.

Tuesday: ICC, 8:00 a.m.

Wednesday: SHDC, 8:00 a.m.

Thursday: SHW, 8:00 a.m.

Friday: SPPN (SPPS students), 8:30 a.m.

Friday: SMH, Noon

While I express regret for this upset in your expectations and schedules, we've come to this point: this has to be, especially if we truly want to offer every opportunity for participation in decisions in the coming year. *This is a decision of the pastor, admittedly arbitrary. Thanks, to our Youth Group Officers. Last week's presentation renewed high school youth leadership in this ministry. Our thanks to Audra Carroll, Cora Hanks, and Lupita Borunda for their presentation at all Masses. A schedule for the 2024-25 year is forthcoming - with our "kickoff" on Sunday evening, August 18.

Parish Leadership Team and Growing Disciples Implementation Committee. Our parish leadership team (given the title, "The Brother Elias Foundation") has added Susan Knipe (working with Erin Cuthbert and me on finances and scheduling), Gene Taylor (RCIA Coordinator and resource in Formation), and Lilian Solano (involved in ministry to Spanish speaking peoples), to its ranks. This year will be a year of constant meetings: and in addition, we will have a Growing Disciples Implementation Committee. I am looking for younger members for this Committee, with a view toward getting younger parishioners familiar with the total picture of overall parish, church, and school operation. We're going to need to bridge into the future in many ways. Fr. T.

Look At What's Returning! On Sunday, August 11, our Spanish Mass returns to ICC, at 5 p.m. On Wednesday, August 14, we have our outdoor Mass of the Assumption of the Blessed Virgin Mary at ICC, with food and fellowship to follow. (St. James Knights of Columbus will make available the opportunity to purchase pavers for our Right to Life Plaza in front of the Church). And on Saturday, August 17, our Healing Service with the ministry of Mr. Roger Shaner returns to SMH.

SPPS Faculty and Pastor Retreat. On August 5 and 6, our pastor and school administration & faculty will be at Sacre Coeur Retreat Center for a brief retreat with other pastors and Catholic school faculties in our area. (Fr. Tony can always get back asap if needed for any emergency needs.)

About CCD and Youth Group Schedules for the Coming Year. First, it was COVID, and all that was lost through the suspension of our churches' efforts to serve our people. Then, Growing Disciples and the vision of our new Bishop, Bishop Louis Tylka, caused further delay as we took part in a discernment process, whose final outcome meant the coming closure of two of our five churches. Through it all, we have: maintained and infused lay leadership into RCIA, with further schedule development; a multi-year phasing in of CCD schedules and locations; and started Youth Ministry. At this time, I want to give you a "Heads Up!" about CCD, because another step in the adjustment and development of religious education outside of our school is taking place this year.

Our CCD coordinator, Trisha Mitchell, will be giving a complete and thorough outlay of our CCD efforts this year. *Keep in mind that Growing Disciples Implementation means that the Mass schedule cannot be changed this year; that's for the fall of 2025.* Be looking for the following: CCD classes will be held at ICC on Saturdays from 2:15 to 3:45 p.m., and at SPPN on Sundays from 8:15 to 9:45 a.m.. Fr. Tony and our deacons will meet with the kids on Saturdays at the beginning of the CCD sessions, and on Sundays at the end of the CCD sessions. There will be an option to enroll at either place, as well as a home school option. (For SHW, SMH, and SHDC churches: if there are children and a catechist who want to keep CCD in their church, we rely on a catechist to come forward. Curriculum choice will be case-by-case.

In conclusion: there will be 16 CCD sessions for the coming year. Because of the dates for Labor Day weekend, Christmas (and vacation), and Easter, we will keep the first and third weekend schedule, *but there will be several sessions that will have to run consecutive weekends.* As previously stated: CCD Coordinator Trisha Mitchell will have more complete information, to follow. Fr. T.
