August 4, 2024 — 18th Sunday in Ordinary Time (B)

A Message from Fr. Tom Donovan:



In this week's Gospel, we see "the crowd" noticing that Jesus had left them after the miracle of loaves and fishes. Of all the things they might be concerned about, I suppose they were wondering about where their next meal might come from? Jesus uses this opportunity to further his teaching by recognizing the people's returning hunger and turning it into a deeper sign of what his ministry was all about. "Do not work for food that perishes, but for food that endures for eternal life" (John 6:27).

Hunger and thirst are two of the most primal needs to be met in the experience of being human. When one is hungry—truly starving—almost every other need will fade in comparison. When one is

thirsty—truly parched—it becomes almost impossible to concentrate on anything but finding a drink of water. In our highly-developed nation, people have probably never experienced slavery to hunger or the oppression of thirst in the way the people of the ancient world did. We see a bit of this distress in the reading about the Israelites who wandered the desert during the Exodus, dependent on the mystical gift of manna.

Jesus wants us to enter into that very human experience of deep hunger and thirst to help us understand how much we depend on his nourishing word, 'the food that endures unto eternal life'. We search for food and seek drink because that need is written on our bodies and therefore in our very nature. In the same way, as creatures created in the image and likeness of God, we need to recognize and embrace God's presence and nourishment and support because it is written onto the very essence of who we are as human beings. To turn away from God is not only 'unnatural', but it is deadly to us. We cannot survive without God and his gifts. When we endure the spiritual discipline of fasting, we take time to become aware of our appetites and our dependence on God for his nourishing grace.

Of all that God gives us, the Eucharistic banquet he sets before us is that richest table of fellowship and nourishment. The Eucharist is food that promises more than momentary satisfaction... it promises Eternal Life. Eternal Life is not only our hope, but it is our God-given destiny; like hunger and thirst, it is imprinted on our very being. But unlike hunger and thirst, we were not created to die, but to live with God forever. Thus, our hunger for God looks to the Eucharist as the "foretaste and promise" of that life we hope to share with him in the banquet of his kingdom in heaven. May God give us the grace to know satisfaction from that spiritual hunger each time we come to Mass!



In just over another week, St. Dominic School will be back in session. Next Sunday we will host our annual "Back to School" Mass on Sunday at 4:00 p.m. at St. Dominic School. Our school families, obviously, are invited to join us, but this is, above all, a parish celebration and all are welcome. After this Mass, there will be a blessing of book bags and a small picnic sponsored by our Men's and Ladies Societies.

With the beginning of school imminent, we have concluded our Wednesday evening Masses at St. Anthony Church. Starting August 21, our weekly Wednesday morning Mass will be at St. Dominic's at 8:30 a.m. For the 2024-25 school year, we are introducing a second weekly opportunity for students and families to attend Mass during the school week. Thus, on Fridays, when school is in session, Mass will be held at St. Dominic School at 8:15 a.m. This will begin on Friday, August 23 at St. Dominic School and will become the parish Mass for Friday, replacing the 7:30 a.m. Mass at St. Anthony. Again, parishioners are welcome to join us for daily Mass at St. Dominic's on both of these days, as the 'daily Mass' for our entire parish community.

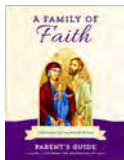

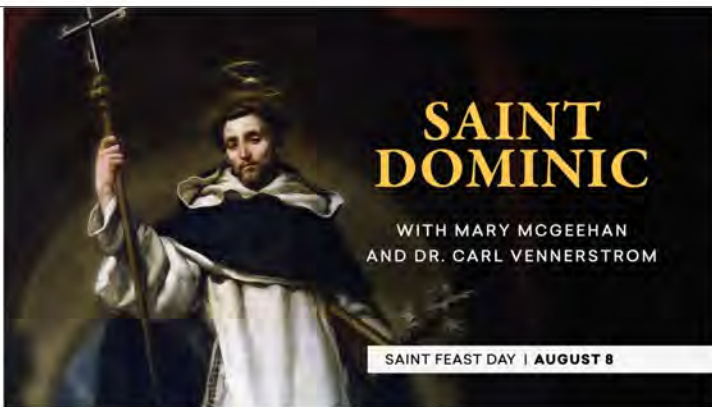
