Exodus 16:2-4,12-15; Ephesians 4:17,20-24;
John 6:24-35

Our Gospel selection last Sunday, this Sunday, and for the following three Sundays is taken from the sixth chapter of the Gospel according to John. Read it carefully! It begins with the “sign” of the multiplication of loaves and fishes. It continues with Jesus’ sermon on the “bread of life.”

At the time of Jesus, the rabbis had a list of more than 400 “signs” which would point to the Messiah. One of these was manna. They thought that the Messiah would give them manna again, and that this manna would not only be for body but also for soul.

The multiplication of loaves and fishes is Jesus’ sign of the new manna. But it must not stop there. Jesus points out that the people aren’t looking for signs; they really only wanted food or bread. He tells them to look for food which will give life eternal.

“Food” or “bread” was a metaphor for the teaching of the Torah (Law of Moses). If a person kept the Torah (ate that food), he would live forever. For this reason, the people answer, “What must we do to keep the works of the Lord?”

Jesus says that he replaces the Torah: they must have faith in him, not the Torah. Jesus points out that neither manna nor the Torah is the real food or bread; he himself is the bread of life. In other words, they must believe in him and keep his teaching to find life. If we want to find happiness in this life and eternal joy in the next, we must keep the teachings of Jesus Christ.

The second reading puts this in different words: If we are Christian, we must not live like pagans with empty minds. We must follow the truth of Jesus Christ. We must put aside the old way of immorality and aimlessness, and live as a new person in God’s image.

Eighteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time, August 4, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

“...By the Eucharistic Celebration we already unite ourselves with the heavenly liturgy and anticipate eternal life, when God will be all in all” (CCC 1326).

As I mentioned in my opening remarks on Sunday’s Homily, we are shifting from the Gospel of Mark and instead we are reading from the Gospel of John which serves as an introduction for a long discourse on Jesus as the Bread of Life. We will be staying with the six chapters of John’s Gospel for the next five Sundays from Seventeenth Sunday to twenty-first Sunday in ordinary time year B. Last Sunday we see Christ our new Elisha, who continues to feed us, his people. He fed more than five thousand people with just five loaves of bread and two fish. He was sensitive to their situation and needs. Christ cares both for our physical and spiritual needs. He feeds us with both His word and the Holy Eucharist. On this eighteenth Sunday of ordinary time, the passage from the Gospel of John is on “Bread of Life Discourses.” Jesus declared that *“I am the Bread of life; whoever comes to Me will never hunger, and whoever believes in Me will never thirst.”* Jesus is offering us the bread that will nourish us for eternal life. The bread that will satisfy our hunger, the spiritual hunger. Our life and satisfaction are no longer dependent only on material things but, more on the spiritual. We need that spiritual nourishment, the bread of life that comes from heaven. So, Christ provides us the spiritual nourishment for our journey through the Eucharist.

The church teaches us that: “The Eucharist is the source and the summit of the Christian life...For in the blessed Eucharist is contained the whole spiritual good of the Church, namely Christ himself...The Eucharist is also the culmination both of God’s action, sanctifying the world in Christ, and of the worship men offer to Christ... In brief, the Eucharist is the sum and summary of our faith...” (CCC 1324-5). Therefore, today’s celebration is a celebration of life, salvation, and grace. It teaches us that as real food, the Eucharist is the true body and blood of Christ which nourishes our soul. It is a concrete way through which Christ is divinely present with us every day and moment. So, when we share in the celebration of the Eucharist, we share in the life of Christ, His head, and in the life of the church, His body. When we receive Holy Communion, we receive Christ Himself. The Bread and Wine are no longer Bread and Wine but, Jesus Himself. He is real presence, food for our souls.

So, Jesus is our King, the most important guest that enters into our souls. Therefore, we need to prepare our souls too, our soul must be free from sins. It is important to eat good food in order to be healthy and fit. If you eat good food, you will be healthy; if you eat bad food, you will be unhealthy; to be fit and healthy, you need to eat good food; eat well to feel well; to stay healthy, it’s best to keep off junk food. You are what you eat! The Eucharist is Food for our souls, we receive the Eucharist, which means we receive Jesus Christ, WE BECOME CHRIST. If we want to be worthy in receiving Jesus in the holy Eucharist, we need to prepare ourselves before receiving Holy Communion by doing an examination of our conscience. There is always a need for repentance, and a need for the Sacramental confession of grave sins before we receive Holy Communion.

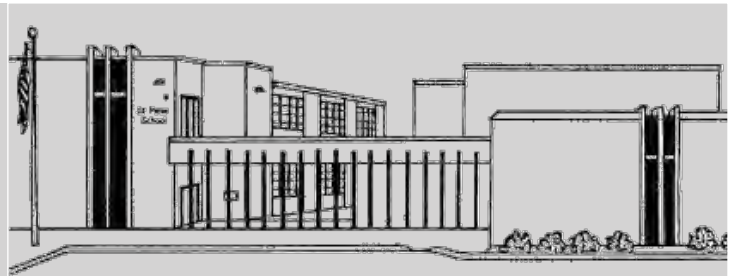

Fr. Paul's column continued..

We should remember the warning given by St. Paul: *“Whoever, therefore, eats the Bread or drinks the Cup of the Lord in an unworthy manner will be answerable for the Body and Blood of the Lord. Examine yourselves, and only then eat of the Bread and drink of the Cup. For all who eat and drink without discerning the Body, eat and drink judgment against themselves.” (1 Cor. 11:27-9).* Therefore, let us receive Holy Communion with fervent love and respect, not merely as a matter of routine. We are called to become Christ-bearers: By receiving Holy Communion we become Christ-bearers as Mary was, with the duty and privilege of conveying Christ to others. let us offer our lives on the altar along with Jesus’ sacrifice, asking pardon for our sins, expressing gratitude for the blessings we have received and say Thank you, Jesus. let us also repeat St. Thomas Aquinas’ prayer of devotion in the presence of the Blessed Sacrament: *“O Sacrament most holy! O Sacrament Divine! All praise and all thanksgiving be every moment Thine!”*






