

Pastor's Letter

August 4, 2024—18th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

Have you ever noticed how the more stuff we have, the more stuff we think we need? When someone is just starting out, maybe with a small income, they might think, "If I just made a little more money I could afford that used car. Then I'd be happy." They start doing a little better and then it's. "If I just made a little more I could afford that new car. Then I would be happy." Before long they're not satisfied with that and it's, "I need that boat or RV or bigger house or (fill in the blank) to make me happy." Our list of things we just have to have is always expanding. Why is that? Why can't the material things we have satisfy us? Because we were not made just for this material world. We were made for heaven.

In our Gospel reading for today Jesus chastises the people who come to him looking for a sign after having experienced his miraculous multiplication of the loaves and fishes. He has fed 5,000 people with just five loaves and a few fish. But now they are hungry again and they want another miraculous meal. Jesus tells them that they are missing the whole point. The multiplication of the physical bread is just a sign of something much more important. The bread of life has come down from heaven to fill their souls and satisfy them in a way that no earthly thing could.

You and I are not just flesh and blood. God has given us immortal souls meant for eternity with him. Material things can't feed our souls and so we always want something more. St. Augustine once said that our hearts are restless until they rest in God. Our restless search for material pleasure, power, and profit is a symptom of a deeper, more fundamental need; the need for reconciliation and communion with God that brings eternal life. No material thing is ever going to be enough. Only faith in Christ can fully meet that need. Do you want to be happy? Work for the bread which comes down from heaven, Jesus Christ, who gives life to the world.
