Isaiah 50:5-9a; James 2:14-18;
Mark 8:27-35

Very likely, the readings for this Sunday were selected because of its closeness to September 14, the Feast of the Triumph of the Cross. When the disciples first started following Jesus, they probably thought he was a great teacher, a healer, and a wonderful rabbi. They did not know that he was the Son of God.

Gradually, through God's revelation, it dawned on them that he was the promised Messiah (or Christ). But they thought that the Messiah would bring perfect peace and justice, an end to all suffering and death, and perfect joy and happiness.

They are completely deflated when Jesus tells them that the Messiah must be rejected, suffer and die! This was a complete contradiction to all Jewish tradition.

When Peter argues with Jesus, Jesus calls him a "satan." "Satan" means "tempter." It was a temptation to Jesus to be a Christ without the cross! It is a temptation to us to want to follow Christ without the cross!

We think that everything in life and in the Church should be perfect if we have faith. Not so! Life is a constant struggle, a continual cross, if we are loyal in following Jesus. To follow him, we must deny even our very selves.

Our first reading is from the Suffering Servant Songs of Isaiah. These poems were used by the primitive Church to explain the mystery of how the Messiah (supposed to be triumphant) could suffer.

Our second reading today tells us that faith without works is dead. We may say that we believe in Jesus, but we must show it in our deeds: by accepting his rule over our lives and by carrying our cross in union with him.

Twenty-fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 15, 2024

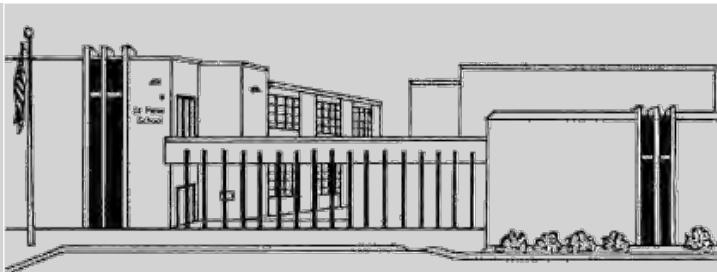
Dear Parishioners,

“Who do people say that I am?” Jesus asks His disciples this interesting question. In other words, Jesus is curious as to what people are saying about Him. Jesus wanted to know how He was coming across to people. It’s not that he was seeking special attention, but rather whether people were grasping this incarnate Son in human nature dwelling among them. But faith isn’t based upon what other people might be saying or believing. So Jesus gets more personal with His apostles and ask the more important question, “But who do you say that I am?” No longer can they refer to someone else but now the question was centered upon them and how they saw Jesus in their lives. This is when Peter responds with those words which would be a challenge for Peter to live when he says, “You are the Christ.” That answer seemed to come from God’s grace dwelling in Peter, God’s grace enlightening Peter to see the workings of God in their midst through the miracles that Jesus was performing. But even though Peter responded with this act of faith in Him, Peter would be challenged by Jesus as to what being the “Christ” meant. If being “Christ” meant a belief in a God whose image was defined by Peter, then that was soon corrected. So when Jesus begins to talk about Himself being rejected and then killed, Peter responds and rebukes Him for having such thoughts. Being the “Christ” in the eyes and thoughts of Peter was not supposed to involve suffering and dying but only a victory over all of those negative elements of life. Then we find Jesus rebuking Peter, “Get behind me Satan, You are thinking not as God does, but as human beings do.” Peter who was praised by Jesus for his thinking is now rebuked for his thinking. Then Jesus seems to tell the apostles and each of us today, “whoever wishes to come after me must deny him (her) self, take up his (her) cross and follow me.” The “Christ” that we believe is the “Christ” who took upon Himself the cross and ushered for us, in that Cross, new life in the resurrection. So Jesus asks, “Who do you say that I am?”

This coming week the priests of the diocese will be gathering for their annual convocation in Collinsville, Illinois. The opening session is on Monday evening, September 16 and will go thru Thursday, September 19. Because of this convocation, we will not be celebrating the Mass on Tuesday and Wednesday, September 17 and 18. Instead, Deacon Bob Lundberg will be having a Communion Service on both of those days. I do plan on returning Wednesday night so that we will have Mass both at QND at 7:00 and 8:00 here on Thursday. Please pray for us as we support each other in our priesthood and come back renewed and refreshed for the challenges ahead.

Our gym work is about to come to its completion. From what I have seen, the gym has undergone a major face lift and I am very impressed with the final product. I do invite you over when it is completed to have a look and be as impressed with it as I am. It is something in which we can all take pride and not worry about it having a bad effect on our students as the old one did. However, we will be having a strict gym policy in the future, plus for any events that are in need of tables and chairs, we will have to invest in a floor covering to protect it from any harm. I thank each of you for your support in this matter.
