Wisdom 2:17-20; James 3:16-4:3;
Mark 9:30-37

The Scripture readings today tell of people who are afflicted with ambition, jealousy, arrogance, and contentiousness. Evil persons cannot put up with good persons: They will ridicule their goodness; they will try to tear down; they will try to get the good person to be just as they are!

Misery loves company. Guilty consciences want everyone else to be guilty. In our modern world, perhaps we should consider it a joy when we are taunted, ridiculed, and made the victim of vicious slander. If the Church is persecuted, it must be doing something right.

The Gospel tells of the ambition of some disciples. They wanted to be above the others. (They thought, of course, that Jesus was going to be an earthly king, and they would sit next to him at court and taste his cup of wine and his food.)

Jesus teaches that humility (not pride) is the virtue. Those who want to be first must take the last place. If we glory in ourselves, our glory is nothing; we must do all for the glory of the Lord. Our ambition should be to outdo others in serving the needs of all.

In the second reading, James tells us that strife and jealousy come from our own inner conflicts: We feel insecure, so we think we must over-compensate by putting others down. When we gossip or find fault, we are admitting that we are insecure.

Yet true security and positive self-image comes from realizing that God loves us. He sent his Son to save us; his Son died for our sakes; let us accept his mercy. If we give of ourselves, we shall find peace of soul and peace with others. Remember the words of Jesus: "The greatest among you will be the one who serves the rest."

Twenty-fifth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 22, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

As we gather this weekend, the Church celebrates the 25th Sunday in Ordinary Time. Our readings today challenge us to look deeply into our human nature, and when we do, we find characteristics that are not becoming of who we would like to be. I was thinking that we so often don't like to clutter our living space with items that make the space look junky and trashy. So we usually hide things in the basement, far from the sight of others. After all, we want to impress others rather than to present a negative image of ourselves. Well, in a sense, our readings are asking us to look into the basement of our lives, and be challenged to uncover and rid ourselves of things accumulated and acquired over the years of living as a human being. For example, our first reading from Wisdom explores the hatred that builds up in ourselves and is evident when we are in the presence of someone who lives how we should live and we don't. Remember in grade school how certain classmates were picked on because they were as we mockingly called them "teacher's pets." When in fact, all they were doing were following what was expected. Grade School, High School, or even in adulthood, we often hold out resentment for these people who are doing right. That's a commentary more of ourselves than them. Then in our second reading, Paul confronts the basement of our lives as he speaks of jealousy and selfish ambition, sources of war and conflicts, of hatred and a complaining spirit. Then finally, in our gospel, Jesus forces His disciples and us to look deeply into our lives to that area of pride and self-importance. After Jesus just finished about speaking of the cross, making a very profound declaration, the disciples were arguing among themselves as to who would be the greatest among them. Wow! So much for our human nature. Fortunately, Jesus doesn't give up on them nor on us. He takes us where we are with the rubbish in our basements, and challenges us to a new way of living, putting aside the old and living His works, "If anyone wishes to be first, he shall be the last of all and the servant of all."

Bishop Paprocki will be in Quincy on Tuesday, September 24, to celebrate the All Catholic Schools Mass at QND at 9:30 a.m. All the Catholic Schools in the area will gather to celebrate a Mass, with the Bishop and Priests of the area, to reflect our unity with each other. You are more than welcome to attend as the celebration will be in the QND gym.

Next weekend, September 28-29, we are celebrating "Priesthood Sunday" as we gather to celebrate the liturgy and to pray for Vocations to the Priesthood and Religious Life. Our priests have been encouraged to speak of their vocation to the priesthood and share a little of their vocation story. In light of this theme, we will be having a Holy Hour for Vocations in St. Peter Church from 6:00-7:00 p.m. I encourage you to come and pray for more vocations.

Our second class for our OCIA process will be this Tuesday, September 24, from 7:00-8:30 p.m. in the Martha Jane Room (below the Church and next to the Cafeteria). If you missed the first class, there is still an opportunity to be a part of the process of discovering more about the Catholic Church. Again, there is not pressure or arm twisting, only an openness to God's grace and call in your life.

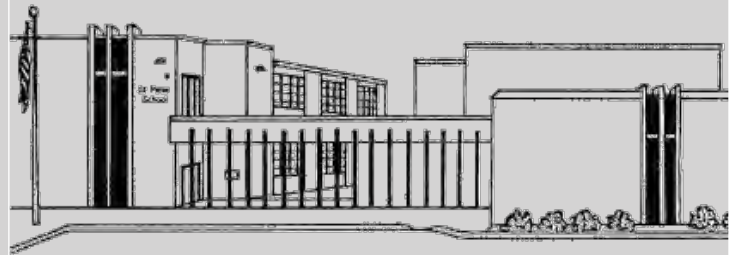

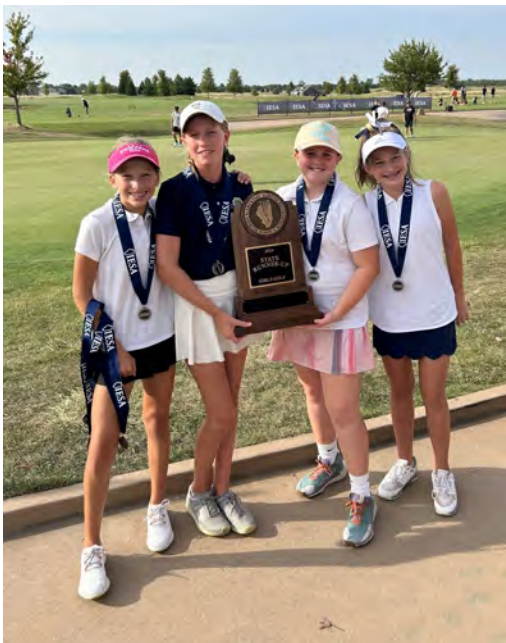


