Numbers 11:25-29; James 5:1-6;
Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

The Book of Numbers is the fourth book of the “Torah” or “Pentateuch” or “Law of Moses.” It is called “Numbers” because of the census of the Israelites in the desert. The book continues the story of the forty years’ wandering of the Israelites in the desert before entering the Promised Land.

In today’s context, Moses is worn out because he tries to do everything by himself. The Lord tells him to appoint seventy “elders” who will help him to judge cases and lead the people. These elders gather, and, through Moses, God sends his spirit upon them.

Two elders were not in the gathering; the others try to stop them from acting as elders. Moses says that he wishes that all were prophets. (In this context “prophet” is one who decides cases and renders decisions.)

A similar case is found in the Gospel. Someone who is not a member of the group of disciples is using Jesus’ name to “cast out demons.” (This means to heal diseases.) The disciples try to stop him. But Jesus says that whoever is not against him is for him.

Jesus goes on to speak of “scandal.” Unfortunately, our translation uses different expressions for the same Greek word *skandalon*: “Lead astray,” “difficulty,” “undoing,” and “downfall” all translate the same word *skandalon*. It means “to cause a person to lose faith.” In context, it is better to lose an eye, a leg, a hand, or even life itself rather than to lose one’s faith.

The second reading continues the “tough” language of James: You can’t take it with you! All your honors, awards, trophies, wealth, trinkets, and possessions will rot. The only thing that will go with you into eternity will be your life of virtue and grace.

My Story

For me, it is a great pleasure meeting you through this medium. I am Fr. Kenneth Ahanonu. You can also call me Fr. Ken or Fr. Kenny. I am excited to be in your midst to minister to you as a parochial vicar and to serve Christ with you. In the lines that follow, I will briefly present myself by telling you the story of my life.

I was born into a family of five kids – three boys and two girls – and I am the last of all. I was born and grew up at Ukpor, a town in the South Eastern part of Nigeria. As it is customary in that part of the world, training to the priesthood consists of formation in minor and major seminaries. While the minor seminary is equivalent to mid and high school level, the major seminary is equivalent to undergraduate level. Thus, my journey to priesthood began after my primary school education (grade six) on September 9, 1995 at St. Paul's Seminary, Ukpor, and then All Hallows Seminary Onitsha for my minor seminary formation. After an apostolic year experience and a spiritual year formation, I proceeded to the major seminary.

The formation in the major seminary includes undergraduate studies in philosophy and theology with a year of apostolic work experience in between the two. While my philosophical studies were at Pope John Paul II Major Seminary, Okpuno Awka, the theological studies were at Blessed Iwene Tansi Major Seminary, Onitsha.

I was ordained a priest on July 14, 2012. I served as a parochial vicar at St. Peter Claver's Parish, Nnewichi Nnewi, for two years. I was then posted to my diocesan minor seminary as a father formator to help in the training of future priests. In 2017, my bishop sent me to Italy for mission and studies. While I ministered in the diocese of Frascati, I undertook post graduate studies and obtained licentiate and Ph.D in Philosophy from the Pontifical Salesian University, Rome.

From Italy, I arrived a few days ago to this beautiful parish with good people. It is a thing of great joy to be in your midst.

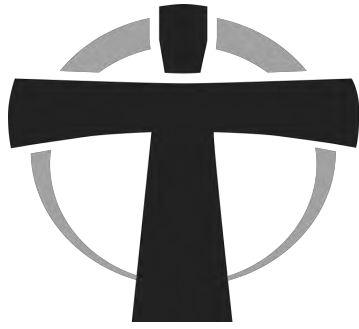
