Numbers 11:25-29; James 5:1-6;
Mark 9:38-43,45,47-48

The Book of Numbers is the fourth book of the “Torah” or “Pentateuch” or “Law of Moses.” It is called “Numbers” because of the census of the Israelites in the desert. The book continues the story of the forty years’ wandering of the Israelites in the desert before entering the Promised Land.

In today’s context, Moses is worn out because he tries to do everything by himself. The Lord tells him to appoint seventy “elders” who will help him to judge cases and lead the people. These elders gather, and, through Moses, God sends his spirit upon them.

Two elders were not in the gathering; the others try to stop them from acting as elders. Moses says that he wishes that all were prophets. (In this context “prophet” is one who decides cases and renders decisions.)

A similar case is found in the Gospel. Someone who is not a member of the group of disciples is using Jesus’ name to “cast out demons.” (This means to heal diseases.) The disciples try to stop him. But Jesus says that whoever is not against him is for him.

Jesus goes on to speak of “scandal.” Unfortunately, our translation uses different expressions for the same Greek word *skandalon*: “Lead astray,” “difficulty,” “undoing,” and “downfall” all translate the same word *skandalon*. It means “to cause a person to lose faith.” In context, it is better to lose an eye, a leg, a hand, or even life itself rather than to lose one’s faith.

The second reading continues the “tough” language of James: You can’t take it with you! All your honors, awards, trophies, wealth, trinkets, and possessions will rot. The only thing that will go with you into eternity will be your life of virtue and grace.

Twenty-sixth Sunday in Ordinary Time, September 29, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

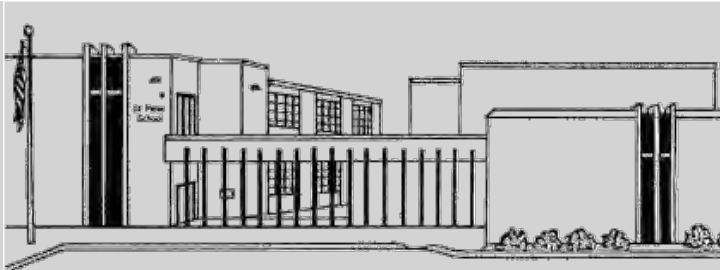
On this last weekend of the month of September the Church celebrates the 26th Sunday in Ordinary time. I know the month of September has 30 days within it, but for some reason it seems to have been extra long in endurance. Perhaps because we started school in mid August, or maybe because of all the athletic events that have been taking place. Whatever the case, we are finally bringing to a close this long month of September. And as we look ahead, I just want to remind you that there are 33 Sundays in this time that we call Ordinary.

As we begin our new month of October, we hopefully will be experiencing within nature the change that we call the Fall Experience. This experience is one of the prime reasons for living in the Midwest, where each October we begin to see mother nature changing within our view. And this change truly does reflect the beauty of Creation. I challenge you to take time to see the transformation of nature that occurs each and every Fall.

Our readings today challenge us to see beyond the confines that we place on our God and appreciate His actions in the lives of others who might be different from us. In our first reading, Joshua was concerned about two men who did not seem to fulfill the “standards of being a prophet.” They were not present when the spirit of Moses was given to the “qualified candidates.” Yet, to the surprise of Joshua, these men were prophesying. And thus Moses says to Joshua, “Would that all the people of the Lord were prophets!” In other words, Moses tells Joshua to let God be God and not to confine God in the image and likeness of himself. Our gospel is also similar as it presents a like problem to Jesus. Apparently John saw someone driving out demons using the name of Jesus and wanted Jesus to stop him since he was not following in the footsteps of the apostles. This is when Jesus says, “whoever is not against us is for us.” In other words, they were reminded that God works in various and strange ways and that we need to let God be God instead of creating our own little bubble, telling Him how He is supposed to act. Thank God that He is God and acts on His own rather than limited to the way we think He should act.

As a parish family, this weekend we are celebrating “Priesthood Sunday”, a Sunday dedicated to praying for more vocations to the priesthood. Without priests, we are not able to celebrate the Eucharist; without priests we are not able to sacramentally receive God’s forgiveness and mercy and be reconciled; and without priests, the spiritual and physical healing would not be ours. In light of this “priesthood Sunday” we are going to have a Holy Hour for Vocations on Sunday night from 6:00-7:00 p.m. in the Church. Included in this hour will be time for prayer before the Blessed Sacrament as well as Benediction at the conclusion of the Holy Hour. Come and pray with us as we ask God to send more workers into His harvest. During our Masses for this weekend, Fr. Paul and myself will share our Vocation story. When was the last time that you invited your son or grandson to consider a vocation to the priesthood? Fact 1, God does call young men to the priesthood. Fact 2, He provides the grace for young men to follow that call. And Fact 3, Serving God and His Church is a very rewarding experience.

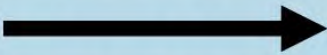


