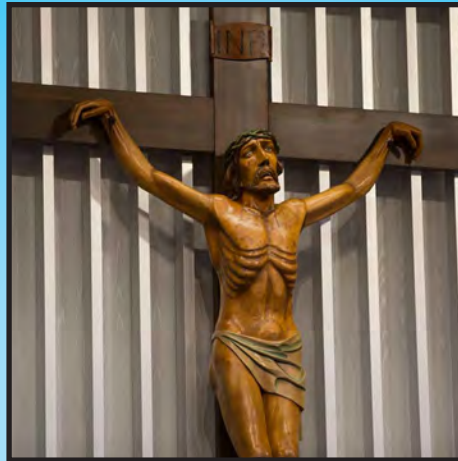

In the first reading, Isaiah gives encouragement to Israelites in Babylon. This passage tells us how we will know that the savior has arrived and that the will of God has been fulfilled—we will see that the eyes of the blind are opened and the ears of the deaf are cleared. All who witness these great deeds of mercy will recognize that Jesus is that long-awaited Messiah.

In the Gospel, notice how Jesus took the deaf man away from the gawking crowd. When a person who lacks hearing learns to speak, the words are usually not very clear. People had probably stared at the man and mocked his speech most of his life. Now the deaf man, after his moment with Jesus, becomes perfected in hearing and speech, proclaiming the greatness of the Lord. Similarly, it is the individual who was bowed down by infirmity, now cured of disease and forgiven of sin,

who can give the most convincing witness to the power of Christ. The victory we have against our infirmities helps us to know the Lord as the true source of our strength.

As you probably know, community members have been meeting for several years to discuss the future of Catholic education in the Quincy area. These discussions have led to the development of a strategic plan as a Catholic Elementary School community, and the formation of a common school advisory board with members from each parish. The goal of the Quincy Catholic Schools initiative is to "form the next generation of Catholic disciples of Christ" while ensuring the sustainability of Catholic education in Quincy for years to come.

Following months of research and dedicated work, the advisory board is excited to announce a *working* facility plan to share with the community—a plan that offers the best solutions for the challenges we currently face as a school community while also creating greater opportunities

for growth both now and in the future. The advisory board will host sharing sessions on September 10 and 11, which will include a presentation of the working facility plan followed by a Q&A segment.

These sessions are intended to start a conversation with the community regarding the future of Quincy's Catholic Schools, in that this plan that is being presented is still what one might consider in the 'blueprints' phase— if we were building a building, we would need to decide schematically what the building will look like, what materials we will use, and what its essential structure will look like and how it will function. This is what has been accomplished thus far. There are still endless details to consider, which may call for tweaking the schematic plan— maybe a little bit, maybe a lot. This is the time to have those discussions, before the significant work of implementing a plan begins. The board is now asking the support of the community and also their advice, thus the reason the board has thoughtfully adopted the language that this is a "working" plan for our discussion. More than 100 people have been involved in this discussion thus far, and now we are asking for your observations and input.

We greatly appreciate your participation in this process and look forward to your feedback and input. Together, we have an incredible opportunity to shape the future of Catholic education in Quincy, building on our rich, 150+ year history. We look forward to seeing you at these sessions.

Fourth Grade Class Leads Morning Assembly in September



During the month of September, our fourth-grade class along with their teacher, Mrs. O'Neal, leads the Morning Assembly for grades K-8. Mrs. O'Neal begins the assembly with prayer by reading the daily Scripture and reflection. Then, students lead the school in the Pledge of Allegiance, read the daily menu, and announce the birthdays for the Birthday Cha-Cha-Cha song. This fourth-grade class will teach us about the first Theological Virtue - Hope. Throughout the year, we will learn about the three Theological Virtues and the four Cardinal Virtues from the Catechism of the Catholic Church 1803-1845. It is a special time to begin each day with Scripture readings, virtue lessons and prayers.

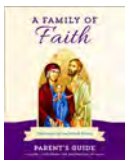

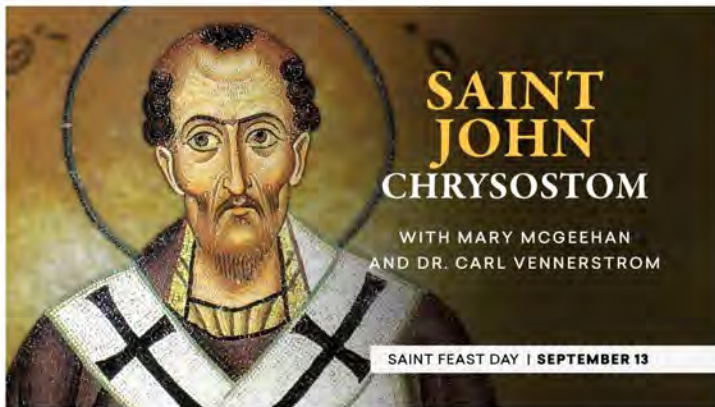
