Isaiah 35:4-7a; James 2:1-5;  
Mark 7:31-37

Jewish tradition taught that all would be perfect when the Messiah came. There would be no more sickness, no more suffering, no more death. Jesus came as the Messiah, and he healed ... but he did not heal all. A few who were blind recovered their sight; a few who were lame walked; a few who were deaf heard.

Why didn't he heal all? The Church answers in two ways: When Jesus Christ comes again in glory, all will be perfect. But, second, while we await his Coming, the Lord expects us to be his instruments in caring for the needy of this world. By our care, we share with Christ in the work of redemption. By our concern, we carry out his mission to heal and restore all.

We as Church, and we as a people show our virtue most perfectly in the way we treat the most vulnerable and the least significant of persons. The Church teaches emphatically that there is a "preferential option" for the poor. By "poor" we mean more than those who have no money; we mean those who are in any kind of need, spiritual, physical, or material.

Our first reading reflects the hope of Israel that all would be perfect when the Messiah came: The blind would see, the lame would walk, the deaf would hear, the mute would speak, the desert would bloom. The Gospel gives an incident of Jesus' healing a deaf mute. (In the ancient world, people thought that saliva had a medicinal power.) The second reading warns us against showing favoritism for the rich and the powerful.

God has chosen those who are nothing in the eyes of the world to be rich in faith. Let us always show our favoritism for those in need; let us strive in our lives to put into effect the "preferential option" for the poor. This does not mean "do-goodism" or the welfare state or socialism. Rather, it means that we strive to relieve suffering and to eliminate the causes of suffering.

**Dear Parishioners,**

This weekend we gather and celebrate the 23rd Sunday in Ordinary time. For the past several days we have been enjoying some great October weather, getting a glimpse of what we hope to have when October does arrive. Whatever the case, it's nice to be able to open up the windows for some fresh air. Unless, of course, you have allergies and apparently these people are suffering from this fall like weather.

Our gospel for our Mass this weekend has special meaning for me in my past experiences as a young priest. When I was ordained, I was sent as my first assignment to Our Saviour Church, Jacksonville. Just when I started to adjust myself to parish life during the months of July and August, I was told in early September that I was to have Mass for the deaf students at the Illinois School for the Deaf on that first Sunday. Not knowing what to expect since I had very little experience with any deaf person, I did as I was told and that day changed my life and my priesthood. I celebrated the Mass in a darkened theater, with an interpreter standing next to me. I experienced the frustration of the young deaf students whose world was far different from mine. Some of them, because of behavior, were escorted out of the Mass. Others just sat there, bored and uninterested as my hearing world was far different than their deaf world. And so in our gospel, as Jesus meets a deaf man, He "puts his finger into the man's ears and, spitting, touched his tongue; then He looked up to heaven and groaned, and said to him, 'Ephphatha', that is 'be opened.' And immediately the man's ears were opened." That first Sunday in September 1975, I found myself with Jesus doing the same for me, saying to me "Ephphatha," "be opened." From that moment on, I resolved that I would try my best to bridge our two worlds, the deaf and hearing, by learning sign language. And you know, from that time on, the young deaf students began to show an interest in our celebrations. This was one of those times that God's amazing grace touched my life and changed me, and in turn, opened up so much for me in my priesthood.

As some of our picnic numbers have come into the rectory, I am being amazed at some of these figures. This year our picnic has been one of the highest in terms of total revenue and even though this is a "fun-raiser" we can still take pride in its financial success. So to all of you who were involved in the picnic in any way from prayers, to financial support, to working at it. I want to once again thank all of you for making it such a great success. Of course, foremost, I want to thank our God for the weather, the fellowship, and this parish family who know how to throw a parish picnic. Finally, I cannot thank our co-chairs enough for their preparation and coordination: Amanda and Randy Martin, Teresa and Brian Baker, James Weisenberger, and Clayton and Niki Cawthon. To each of you, I thank you for your labor of love.

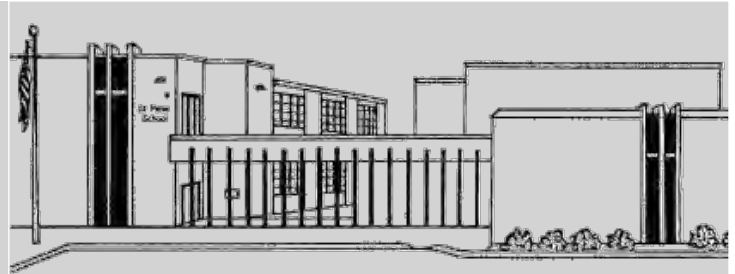

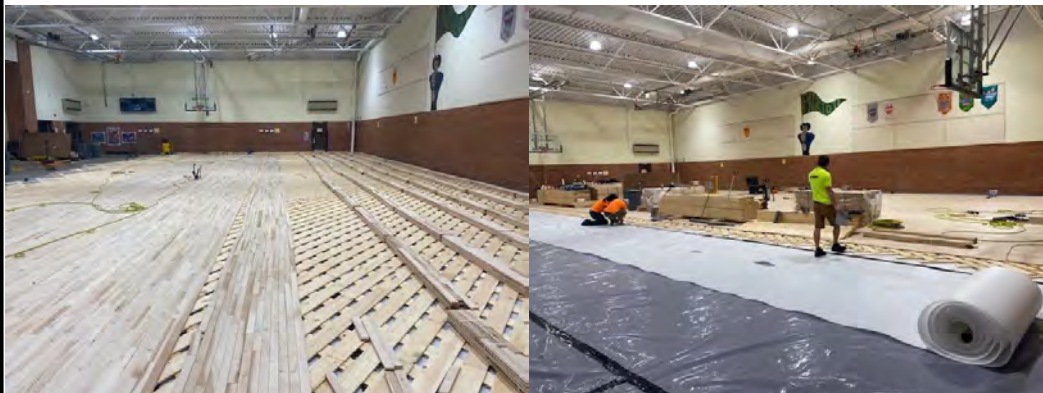
### WORKING FACILITY PLANNING MEETINGS

# Parish in Action

September, 2024

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

The social, spiritual, and psychological effects of the COVID-19 pandemic adversely affected societies throughout the world. Lockdowns, social isolation, loss of jobs, and other factors have all disrupted the faith and family lives of people around the world—including in Africa, where social isolation and church closures negatively impacted the way that Catholics in Uganda lived their faith daily. In Kenya, the challenges posed by COVID-19 deeply affected marriage and family life; and conflict, poverty, and rates of death, including death from suicide, increased. The breakdown of families and many people's isolation and loss of hope formed a crisis that needed a compassionate pastoral response.

The *Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa* stood ready to assist African Church leaders who reached out for help to renew faith, strengthen families, and heal the wounds that lingered in the pandemic's aftermath. The Uganda Episcopal Conference used a grant from the Solidarity Fund to gather 250 priests, religious brothers and sisters, and laity from ten Ugandan dioceses for a series of workshops. Participants focused on understanding the pandemic and its effects on the faith of the people. They also discussed lessons learned about ways to respond to a similar future crisis so they can bring back those who might leave the Church during the crisis.

The Solidarity Fund awarded a grant of collection funds to the Kenya Conference of Catholic Bishops to implement its program to reinvigorate marriage and family life in the Diocese of Nakuru. Trained married couples, clergy, religious brothers and sisters, and catechists facilitated workshops for 450 participants on topics that included marriage preparation, Christian family life, and Natural Family Planning. Participants also learned how to provide pastoral care to people in isolated and vulnerable groups, including prisoners, homeless families, families of truck drivers and fishing industry workers, and prostitutes and their families. When you participate in the collection for the Solidarity Fund for the Church in Africa, your contribution helps the Church reach out to the people most in need and bring them pastoral care.

The Church in Africa joyfully lives and shares the merciful love of Jesus through its ministries to families, youth, and people made vulnerable or marginalized by poverty. Though it is rich with a spirit of missionary discipleship, it needs your help to carry out its mission. 
