Wisdom 7:7-11; Hebrews 4:12-13; Mark 10:17-30

The Book of Wisdom (from which our first reading is taken) is attributed to Solomon. Very likely, however, he did not write it. But the "first person" (the "I") is intended to be Solomon. The reading alludes to the famous story of young Solomon who became king after his father, David.

God told Solomon that he would grant one request. Instead of asking for wealth or long life or health, Solomon asked for <u>wisdom</u>. Wisdom is the gift of putting everything in its proper place. Wisdom is the gift of finding the true meaning and goal of life. Wisdom is knowing how everything fits together to achieve that goal.

Today's first reading is Solomon's description: "I prayed, and prudence was given to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne..." True wisdom leads to eternal life. The rich young man in the Gospel wanted everlasting life, but he did not want to make the sacrifices necessary to attain it.

True wisdom moves us to sacrifice present goals for future fulfillment. Wisdom does not come to most of us instantly or automatically; we must constantly strive for wisdom.

The second reading gives us a great source for wisdom: "God's word is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword. It penetrates the spirit." In other words, God's word forces us to be honest in seeking real truth instead of smooth talk and half truths.

God's word cuts through to our soul and lets us know when we are rationalizing or temporizing or deceiving ourselves. Let us seek true wisdom which will move us to devote all that we are and all that we have to God's greater glory.

Fellow Parishioners,



If we have not met before, please allow an introduction. My name is Jane Ann Petty and I am the Youth Ministry Coordinator here at St. Francis Solanus. My husband Jonas and I have been married for almost 23 years and we have four children. I am a convert to Catholicism, and was baptized into the Church 21 years ago. I can honestly tell you that my Catholic faith has grown leaps and bounds since I began working with youth five years ago. They have an awesome perspective on life and our faith, ask amazing

questions, and consistently remind me that having fun is an awesome part of being human.

BEAR is the name of the youth group here at St. Francis Solanus and our slogan is "Friends who bear the love of Christ." This group consists of children who are 6th grade through 12th grade, (11-18 years of age), from multiple parishes, and many school settings. We meet on Monday evenings from 7:15 until 8:30 in our parish center. Our most recent meeting included a Rosary Walk around the Church property! Many of the meetings include a snack, and visiting time where the kids can nurture their relationships through fellowship. We also discuss different saints and feast days, and this year we will host our Third Annual All Souls Cemetery Adoration Night. This week we hear in Mark's Gospel about a man who comes to Jesus, and he essentially says, "Ok, I've checked all of the boxes. I follow this commandment and that commandment, and even this one! Now I go to Heaven, right?" Jesus' reply is not what the man wants to hear and so he goes away sad. Can you imagine Jesus looking at you with love and still going away sad? I can. I would bet that if you really think about it you will also reply, "Yep, me too."

As human beings, we often get attached to earthly things. This feeling can be so strong that even with Christ's loving gaze upon us all the time, letting go of our attachment to these things, and taking Him into our hearts, is hard. This can even make us sad or angry. But here's the thing, when you shed those attachments and make Christ the priority, you will find purpose and joy in prayer, in the Mass, in your weekly contribution, in confession, in marriage, and even in suffering because Christ is being brought closer to your heart. Then you can share Him with others, and the sacramental life no longer feels like work because the sacraments are seen for what they are, which are outward signs of God's grace instituted by Jesus Christ.

St Augustine famously said, "Our hearts are restless, Lord, until they rest in you." Of course we are all human beings, and we often miss the mark of doing God's will. Thankfully we can come to Him in confession, and in the Eucharist where He lovingly looks at us, forgives us, and guides us. It is our duty to take this love and go, not sad, but happy. This happiness lies in the wisdom which is so beautifully described by the author in the first reading. Acquiring true wisdom consists of trusting in God and allowing Him to lead and inspire us.
