Wisdom 7:7-11; Hebrews 4:12-13;  
Mark 10:17-30

The Book of Wisdom (from which our first reading is taken) is attributed to Solomon. Very likely, however, he did not write it. But the “first person” (the “I”) is intended to be Solomon. The reading alludes to the famous story of young Solomon who became king after his father, David.

God told Solomon that he would grant one request. Instead of asking for wealth or long life or health, Solomon asked for wisdom. Wisdom is the gift of putting everything in its proper place. Wisdom is the gift of finding the true meaning and goal of life. Wisdom is knowing how everything fits together to achieve that goal.

Today’s first reading is Solomon’s description: “I prayed, and prudence was given to me. I preferred her to scepter and throne...” True wisdom leads to eternal life. The rich young man in the Gospel wanted everlasting life, but he did not want to make the sacrifices necessary to attain it.

True wisdom moves us to sacrifice present goals for future fulfillment. Wisdom does not come to most of us instantly or automatically; we must constantly strive for wisdom.

The second reading gives us a great source for wisdom: “God’s word is living and effective, sharper than any two-edged sword. It penetrates the spirit.” In other words, God’s word forces us to be honest in seeking real truth instead of smooth talk and half truths.

God’s word cuts through to our soul and lets us know when we are rationalizing or temporizing or deceiving ourselves. Let us seek true wisdom which will move us to devote all that we are and all that we have to God’s greater glory.

*Twenty-eighth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 13, 2024*

**Dear Parishioners,**

A question on which each of us has thought some time in our lives, is the question the young man asked of Jesus in our gospel today. The young man runs up to Jesus and asks, “Good teacher, what must I do to inherit eternal life?” We might think that to be an odd question, but as people who always are confronted with the reality of death, it is an important question to ask. The lives that we live here are very fragile, and we never know their expiration date. And so in light of those limitations, we too would like to know what we can do to secure that eternal life. Jesus tells the young man that the beginning steps is to keep the commandments of God. The young man responded that he has kept them from his youth. Then Jesus who saw his goodness and loved him, challenged him to “go, sell what you have, give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven; and then come, follow me.” This challenge was just too much for this young man. The words of the gospel say so much as it states: “at that statement, his face fell, and he went away sad, for he had many possessions.” Perhaps this story might challenge us to look into our own lives and to see what dominates those lives. Are the things that dominate things of this earth? If so, we might be like that young man who went away from Jesus rather sad because these things control us and set our priorities. The only thing about these things are that they are not lasting. Our faith, our hope, and our love of Jesus are the things that should dominate our lives and control what we do. May each of us check our priorities and set them right with Jesus.

This weekend our vocation committee of our parish have designated this weekend to thank our deacons who serve our parish. And so, to Deacon Bob Lundberg, and to Deacon Jeff Wolf, our prayers are with you and for you as we pray for you this weekend. May God continue to bless your service.

I want to remind you that this Sunday night, October 13, we will be honoring Our Lady of the Rosary with a special prayer service. We will gather at 6:30 p.m. in the Church and then process around our Church grounds while we pray the rosary. The evening service will conclude with Benediction. Please join us as we honor Our Lady of the Rosary.

Another comforting ministry that we offer here at St. Peter’s for those who have suffered the loss of a loved one is a four week class entitled “A time to Mourn.....A time to Heal.” These classes will be on October 16, 23, 30, and November 6, at 4:30 p.m. in the parish office. The death of a loved one often pushes us into grief and healing from grief takes time and a willingness to share. If interested, please call the parish office 217-222-3155.

Once again if you have not participated in our Upon this Rock capital campaign I am asking for you to consider doing so. 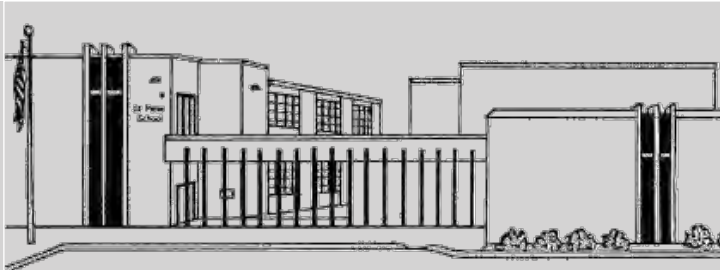

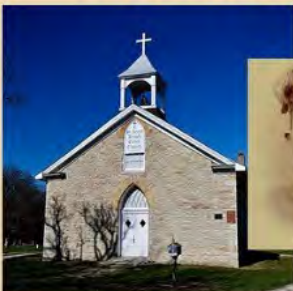

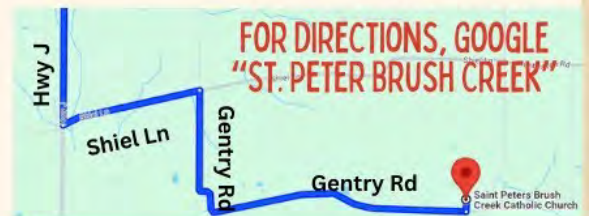

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 20, as we observe World Mission Sunday, we stand in solidarity with the Missions of the Church, to proclaim the salvation of Christ to all nations. Pope Francis reflected on this year's theme: "Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet" Matthew 22:9. The invitation to the banquet is linked to the Eucharistic table, where believers share the Body and Blood of Christ, anticipating the final Banquet.

Participating in World Mission Sunday is a tangible way for Catholics to live out the Great Commission, bringing the message of Christ to every corner of the earth. It's an expression of solidarity with missionaries and a means to share Christ's love universally.

Founded by French laywoman Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is an essential source of aid for the Church's missionary work. In the United States, we benefited from these donations: up until 1908, we received close to 7 million dollars, the equivalent of over 250 million today. Those dioceses in our country, considered mission territories, continued to receive subsidies. Fairbanks, Alaska, was the last of those dioceses and received its final subsidy payment just last year!

The World Mission Sunday collection assists the Holy Father to meet his Petrine obligation to build up the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and/ or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages, and enables missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas, and to meet essential works to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

Embodying this year's theme of World Mission Sunday, I urge you to keep your hearts aflame with the word of God, open the eyes of others to Jesus in the Eucharist, and your feet moving inviting everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation. Your prayers are invaluable, and your financial support provides life-giving aid to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.


