Pastor's Letter

October 13, 2024—28th Sunday in Ordinary Time

Dear Church Family,

Today we begin our Season of Stewardship. Catholics across the Diocese of Springfield are invited to think deeply for the next couple of weeks about what it means to be a missionary disciple of Jesus Christ. We are invited to consider how much God has done for us and how much he gives to us every day. Through the life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ we have the hope of eternal life. Our faith in Christ makes that hope a reality now and in the age to come. Right now, God gives us strength, wisdom, and joy by revealing himself to us in sacred Scripture and the tradition of the church and he pours his power and love into us through the sacraments. All this is in addition to the beauty and bounty of the created world which he has given us to use, enjoy, and care for. Everything we have, everything we are, and everything and everyone we love are gifts from our heavenly Father.

How are we going to respond to that? That is what stewardship is all about. Stewardship is the grateful response of the Christian disciple to the immeasurable richness of God's mercy and generosity to us. We can never repay God for all his blessings, but we can show our gratitude by sharing our possessions, time, and ability in service to his church. When we think of all that God has done for us and given to us, how can we not want to show our thankfulness?

And giving back some of our time, talent and treasure is not just a sign of gratitude, it is essential to living out our calling as followers of Jesus. True faith is faith that is lived out in action. Discipleship is living our lives in imitation of Christ who gave himself completely for us, giving even his life on the cross so that we might live. He gave it all, and he asks us to do the same. In our Gospel reading for today a man comes to Jesus and asks, "What must I do to inherit eternal life?" Jesus replies, "Sell what you have, give to the poor and you will have treasure in heaven; then come, follow me."

When we think about how much we might give to the church, we think of dollar amounts or, if we get a little more serious about it we might even think in terms of percentages of our income, like the scriptural 10% tithe. That is appropriate and necessary, but the challenging fact is that God doesn't just want our stuff, he wants all of us. He wants us to turn our lives over to him for him to guide according to his plan for us. The great mystery is that the more we empty ourselves in service to him and to our neighbor, the fuller and richer our lives become.

During this Season of Stewardship may our hearts be opened up to the truth of what a blessing it is to be a blessing by joyfully and generously sharing ourselves and our gifts.







Do you think Jesus wants everyone to give away everything they have?


