Jeremiah 31:7-9; Hebrews 5:1-6;
Mark 10:45-52

There are none so blind as those who will not see, and none so deaf as those who will not hear. Physical blindness is a terrible handicap; spiritual blindness is worse! Jesus is on his way to Jerusalem where he will be rejected by those who are spiritually blind. He will die because of them.

The last stop before Jerusalem was Jericho. He encounters a blind beggar and he cures him. He could cure physical blindness, but he cannot cure spiritual blindness unless a person WANTS to be cured!

Christians are supposed to be a people of joy. All things work together for the good of those who love God. The Lord promises us eternal happiness; he forgives our sins; he strengthens us in our weaknesses: All this is JOY!

But we can close our eyes and drag our chin in depression. We can choose to look down instead of up. We can think of the bad instead of the good. We can criticize instead of construct. We can choose to be blind.

Let us not wallow in self-pity, even when we are called to bear heavy crosses. Jesus helps us to shoulder our burden; he is with us; he can even cure of us our spiritual blindness if only we want to be cured.

Resolve today to be a person of joy: Let go of past hurts and grudges; commend your enemies to God's care. Emphasize the positive, and let go of the negative. Always build up, and never tear down. Always forgive as you want the Lord to forgive you. Do to others what you hope the Lord will do to you. Then you will be a person of joy – You will have better than 20/20 spiritual vision!

Thirtieth Sunday in Ordinary Time, October 27, 2024

Dear Parishioners,

It is hard to believe that the month of October is coming to a close. In fact, as we celebrate the 30th Sunday in Ordinary time, the number of this Sunday indicates that we have only about four Sundays left in this time before we begin another season of Advent. There are 33 Sundays in Ordinary Time and then it concludes with the Solemnity of Christ the King. Not wanting to rush Christmas but it will be here in no time.

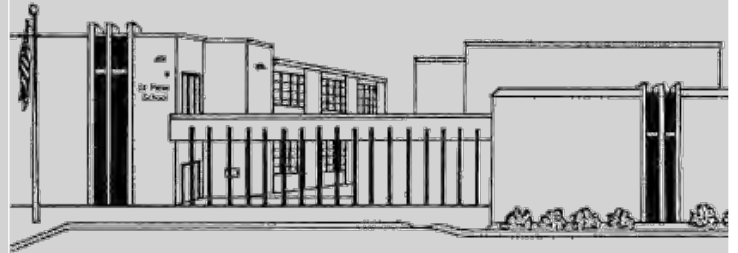
For the past several weeks, our gospels present Jesus entering the lives of people who need Him, or seeking something from Him. In our gospel for this Sunday, Jesus is approached by a blind man and Jesus asks, “what do you want me to do for you?” It’s the same question Jesus asked his apostles last weekend who wanted to ask if they could sit at His right and His left in His kingdom. For the blind man all he was asking of Jesus was to be able to see. His blindness kept him separate from people; his blindness limited what he could and could not do; and his blindness seemed to reflect an attitude that said that sin was the cause of it. Whatever the case, the blind man begged to be able to see again. And Jesus obliged him this miracle saying to him “go your way, your faith has saved you.”

This weekend we begin our Stewardship Renewal. Our psalm today proclaims, “The Lord has done great things for us; we are filled with joy.” The blind man could attest to that statement as Jesus truly did great things for him in restoring his sight. But so often my brothers and sisters we are blinded to what the Lord has done for us. We take so often our blessings and gifts for granted that we often become blind to the great things the Lord does for us. And so, each year we challenge you to open up our eyes and hearts and see what the Lord truly has done for us. The blessings that we have, and the gifts given to us are to be shared and not kept for ourselves. Our time, talents, and treasures are meant to be given away and to the extent that we do, we are being stewards of God’s gifts. As we introduce our stewardship renewal, I ask you to pray over your packet of information and then with generous and loving hearts allow God to help you fill out the information requested. And please listen to our speakers this weekend and the following two weekends.

This weekend, I plan on opening up our school gym and inviting you over to take a look at our new gym floor. It really is amazing the work that has been done, removing the mercury laden rubber floor and now installing a new and fresh wood floor for years of use. We also have our new mats that will be used to protect our floor during assemblies and dinners. Thank you for your stewardship and making this possible.

Next Friday, November 1, is All Saint’s Day and is a Holyday of Obligation for all Catholics. Our Mass schedule will be as follows: 5:30 p.m. Vigil Mass on Thursday night; then on Friday, 8:30 a.m. Mass with our Grade School, 10:00 a.m. Mass at Quincy Notre Dame gym, 12:10 Mass and 5:30 p.m. Mass. Then on Saturday, November 2, All Soul’s Day, we will have our customary Mass of Remembrance at 5:00 p.m. for all parishioners who have died this past year, may their souls rest in peace!
