From the Pastor's Desk

Today we celebrate the 27th Sunday of Ordinary Time. In the gospel Jesus summarizes the Lord's teaching on marriage. "So they are no longer two but one flesh. Therefore what God has joined together, no human being must separate." Jesus teaches that husbands and wives form a partnership that lasts a lifetime. Between two baptized Christians this partnership becomes a special sacrament. This partnership images the everlasting covenant formed between Christ and the Church. We therefore pray for married couples that they may persevere through both the happy and the challenging times of their lives.

Today is **Respect Life Sunday**. Today the Church celebrates Respect for all Human Life from conception until natural death. Sins that are contrary to basic human dignity include murder, abortion, embryonic stem-cell research and cloning, euthanasia and physician-assisted suicide, and the death penalty. May we continue to defend the dignity of all human life.

Next weekend (October 12-13) we will hear our annual Lay Witness Talk in preparation for our annual Stewardship Sunday (October 26-27). We thank our parish members for their courage and witness that inspire us in our own journey of discipleship and stewardship.

This month we begin our **October Count** of all persons attending Mass on the weekends of October. These numbers assist the Springfield Diocese in their continued efforts of pastoral planning.

Friday, October 18 @ 5:30 p.m.: Health Care Mass. Traditionally known as the White Mass, this Mass is celebrated to honor doctors, nurses, medical technicians, hospital administrators, and emergency personnel in appreciation for their service to the local community. This Mass will be a wonderful opportunity for our parish community to thank the members of our Healthcare community for the tremendous work they continue to do for our Quincy area community.

Next Sunday, October 13 Quincy Cursillo is celebrating their 50th Anniversary with a 2 p.m. Mass at Quincy Notre Dame High School. We say congratulations to Quincy Cursillo for the many men and women who have encountered Christ in a very powerful way through the weekends they sponsor throughout the year. 

During the Easter Vigil liturgy, the single flame of the Easter candle shines through the darkness. That small flame spreads as each person's candle is lit and the light of Christ is shared with others. Before we know it, the entire Church is ablaze with the warm glow of candlelight and the darkness has been vanquished.

We are each called by God to be that light of Christ that breaks through the darkness. We are called to be his disciples, continually transformed by our encounter with him and sharing in his mission. Jesus came that we might have life.

Part of the impetus for the Eucharistic Revival was a concern that some Catholics do not believe, or at least do not understand, that Jesus is truly present in the Eucharist. Even though our human senses perceive bread and wine, the Eucharist is Jesus—body, blood, soul, and divinity. Similarly, many people do not realize or acknowledge the sanctity of human life when it is hidden in the womb. Both instances call for us to help others recognize these sacred gifts that may not be perceivable through our human senses. We need to help others understand that just because something may not be apparent to our eyes does not mean that it is not there or that it is not important.

care and protection. Pope Francis reminds us that "every child who, rather than being born, is condemned unjustly to being aborted, bears the face of Jesus Christ, bears the face of the Lord, who even before he was born, and then just after birth, experienced the world's rejection." 1

The U.S. bishops have affirmed that, while it is important to address all the ways in which human life is threatened, "abortion remains our preeminent priority as it directly attacks our most vulnerable brothers

and sisters, destroying more than a million lives each year in our country alone."

In the face of challenges such as abortion and physician-assisted suicide, we may feel that we are not equal to the task of overcoming the darkness. Yet, we are not alone. Jesus tells us, "I am with you always, until the end of the age" (Matthew 28:20). The God who became man to save us still dwells among us. For Christ is "the light [that] shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it" (John 1:5). He is the one who overcame death and continually raises us to new life. He remains close to us always, seeking us out in each moment of our lives. Jesus gave his very flesh to give us the gift of eternal life and invites us to the most profound experience of this gift in our celebration of the Eucharist. When we meet Jesus in the Eucharist, this encounter has the power to change us. The Eucharist has the power to transform the depths of our hearts and the heart of our culture. United to the power of his Eucharistic Presence, may we work to ensure that each person has life—and has it in abundance.



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

On October 20, as we observe World Mission Sunday, we stand in solidarity with the Missions of the Church, to proclaim the salvation of Christ to all nations. Pope Francis reflected on this year's theme: "Go and Invite Everyone to the Banquet" Matthew 22:9. The invitation to the banquet is linked to the Eucharistic table, where believers share the Body and Blood of Christ, anticipating the final Banquet.

Participating in World Mission Sunday is a tangible way for Catholics to live out the Great Commission, bringing the message of Christ to every corner of the earth. It's an expression of solidarity with missionaries and a means to share Christ's love universally.

Founded by French laywoman Blessed Pauline Jaricot in 1822, the Society for the Propagation of the Faith is an essential source of aid for the Church's missionary work. In the United States, we benefited from these donations: up until 1908, we received close to 7 million dollars, the equivalent of over 250 million today. Those dioceses in our country, considered mission territories, continued to receive subsidies. Fairbanks, Alaska, was the last of those dioceses and received its final subsidy payment just last year!

The World Mission Sunday collection assists the Holy Father to meet his Petrine obligation to build up the Church in over 1,100 dioceses and territories that are too young and/or too poor to sustain themselves. Offerings support the formation of seminarians and religious men and women, assist in the construction of schools and orphanages, and enables missionaries to build churches in remote and resource-limited areas, and to meet essential works to proclaim the Gospel and celebrate the Sacraments.

Embodying this year's theme of World Mission Sunday, I urge you to keep your hearts aflame with the word of God, open the eyes of others to Jesus in the Eucharist, and your feet moving inviting everyone to walk together on the path of peace and salvation. Your prayers are invaluable, and your financial support provides life-giving aid to our brothers and sisters in the world's most vulnerable communities.
